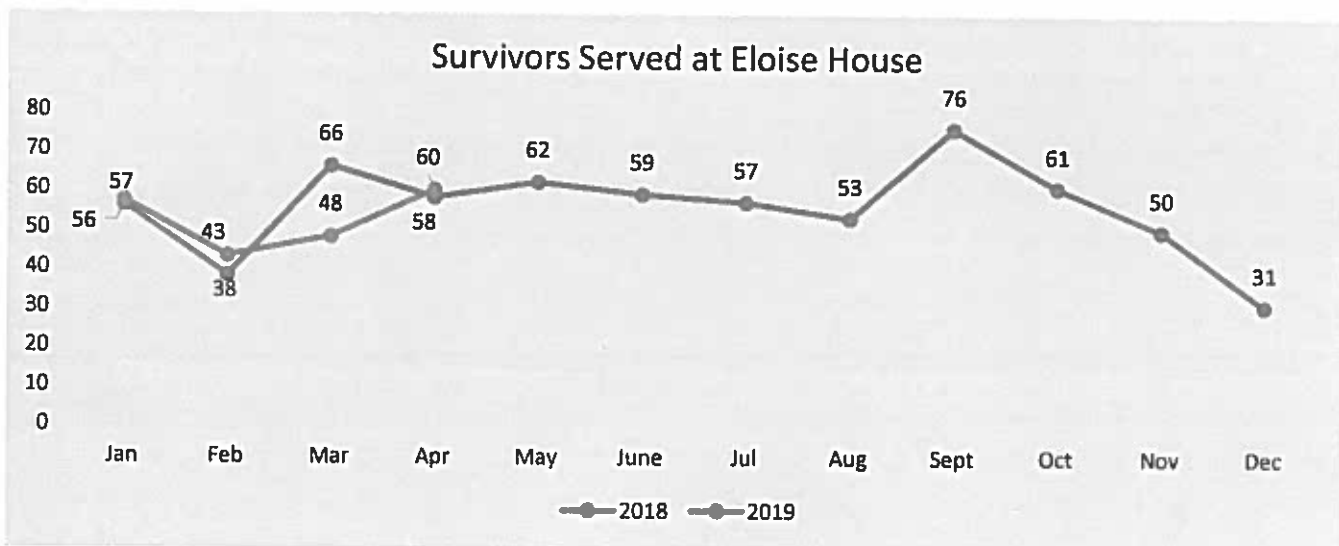

Reasons survivor may receive SAFE at a facility outside Eloise House (e.g. hospital):

- Survivors is not aware of the option to get the exam at Eloise House, and presents at the hospital
- Medical necessity, such as injury that requires ICU care

Even in a hospital, consent is necessary for a SAFE because it's not emergency medical care:

"Exam facilities should also have policies in place to address consent for treatment in cases in which patients are unconscious, intoxicated, or under the influence of alcohol or drugs, and are therefore temporarily incompetent to give consent."
