HISTORIC LANDMARK COMMISSION MAY 20, 2019 DEMOLITION AND RELOCATION PERMITS HDP-2019-0124 1201 AZIE MORTON ROAD

PROPOSAL

Demolish a ca. 1952 house.

ARCHITECTURE

One- and two-story, irregular-plan, flat-roofed brick-veneered house with International style influences; metal-framed multi-lite casement windows; stone front deck with a wrought-iron railing; several frame additions to the rear.

RESEARCH

The house was built in 1952 by Joe Lewis Joseph, a plumbing supply business owner. He and his wife, Katherine, moved here from a house on Northwood Road and lived here for the rest of their lives. After Joe Lewis' death in 1960, Katherine Joseph continued to live in this house; she worked as a realtor.

Joe Lewis Joseph was a member of Austin's large Joseph family, Joe Lewis was the first generation of the Josephs born in Austin after the family moved here from what is now Lebanon. The Josephs had typical occupations for Lebanese immigrants – they ran fruit stands, confectionaries, and groceries. Their descendants, such as Joe Lewis, diversified their business interests.

This house sits on almost an acre of land and has views out over Barton Creek and Zilker Park to the hills west of the city.

STAFF COMMENTS

The house is beyond any city survey to date.


Staff has evaluated this house for designation as a historic landmark and has determined that the house may meet the criteria for landmark designation as set forth in City Code:

- a. **Architecture.** The house is a good local example of a vernacular adaptation of the International style in its boxy configuration and fenestration systems. Austin has very few examples of the International style in residential architecture.
- b. **Historical association**. The house was the long-time home of Joe and Katherine Joseph, members of a prominent Austin Lebanese-American family; more information will be necessary to assess whether the house qualifies for landmark designation based upon its associations with Joe Lewis and Katherine Joseph.
- c. **Archaeology**. The house was not evaluated for its potential to yield significant data concerning the human history or prehistory of the region.
- d. **Community value**. The house is located close to the summit of the hill overlooking Zilker Park, and has magnificent views to the west, but is somewhat hidden from the road and therefore may not have the requisite presence in the neighborhood to qualify for community value.
- e. **Landscape feature**. The property is not a significant natural or designed landscape with artistic, aesthetic, cultural, or historical value to the city.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION


Initiate historic zoning or postpone again to June 24, 2019 to fully evaluate options other than demolition of this house. The house appears to meet the criterion for designation for its architectural merit, with a not-as-strong case for historical associations outside of the associations with a prominent Lebanese-American family in Austin.

BIOGRAPHICAL NOTES:

Joe L. and Katherine Joseph (ca. 1952 – ca. 1973)

His World War I draft registration card shows that Joe L. Joseph was living at 106 E. 1st Street in Austin. He was born in Austin in 1897, and was not employed. He was of medium height and had a stout build, brown eyes and black hair.

The 1940 U.S. Census shows Joe L. and Katherine Joseph as the owners of the house at 1600 Northwood Road; that house was worth \$5,000. Joe L. Joseph was 41, had been born in Texas, and was an instructor at the College of Beauty Culture. Katherine Joseph was 36, had been born in Texas, and was also an instructor at the College of Beauty Culture. They had 6 children: Norraine, 18; Marjorie, 13; Theresa, 12; Rose Marie, 10; Joan, 7; and Joe L., Jr., 2.ad no occupation listed. All of the children had been born in Texas, and none had an occupation listed.

His 1960 death certificate shows that Joe Lewis Joseph was living in this house (then addressed as 1201 Robert E. Lee Road) at the time of his death. He was born in 1897 in Austin, and was in the plumbing business.

JOE JOSEPH SR.

Joe Joseph Sr., 1201 Robert E. Lee Road, died in a local hospital Friday afternoon. He was a lifelong resident of Austin, owner of a plumbing concern, veteran of World War I. member of St. Ignatius Church, and member of Knights of Columbus. Survivors are his wife. Mrs. Katherine Joseph; five daughters. Mrs. M. A. Saad, Beirut, Lebanon; Mrs. Ben Paykin, New York; Mrs. Thomas Kelley, San Francisco, Calif.; Mrs. John McNaw, San Antonio; Miss Theresa Joseph, Austin; two sons, Joe L. Joseph Jr., and Daniel Joseph, Austin; two sisters, Mrs. Carl Norton, Tulsa, Okla.; Mrs. Sam Emmett, Dallas; seven brothers, Harry Joseph, Sammie Joseph, Phillip Joseph, Ernest Joseph, Edward Joseph, Cecil Joseph, all of Austin; and Johnnie Joseph, San Antonio.
