Here's the list of potential recommendations regarding Budget 2020 on the agenda for our ZAP meeting tomorrow night. Commissioner Denkler and I discussed the first four items on this list last Wednesday.

- Additional transportation engineers to facilitate traffic impact reviews on land development and zoning cases.
 - Implement an affordable housing monitoring fee on density bonus programs to facilitate City efforts to monitor, verify and promote compliance with affordable housing density bonus program requirements.
 - Additional funds to implement and maintain the Neighborhood Housing and Community Development Department's online website/database of existing market affordable housing.
 - Additional planning staff to facilitate small area planning efforts.
 - Implement new rough proportionality traffic impact fees as soon as possible.

- Enhance the Public Works Department and Watershed Department budgets to address climate change and implement Atlas 14 flood maps.
