



ONION CREEK FLOODPLAIN BUYOUT PROGRAM:


813 houses removed from 25 and 100-year floodplains

- 483 with matching funds from US Army Corps of Engineers (USACE) partnership
 - 1998-2017
- 340 funded 100% by COA WPD
 - 2014-2018
 - 10 homes left (refused offer)



ONION CREEK FLOODPLAIN BUYOUT PROGRAM:

ARMY CORPS PARTNERSHIP



Yarrabee Bend Recreation Area – USACE project

- Street removal and conversion to trails
 - Concrete and gravel
- Added parking and restroom
- Designated ecosystem restoration areas (over 200 acres) with tree plantings
- Low water crossing trail
- 31 pavilions
- Ribbon cutting held June 22











FLOODPLAIN BUYOUTS IN AUSTIN


MANAGING NEW OPEN SPACE

- Once acquired, added to mowing contract
 - 4-6 times per year depending on site
- Community engagement after 1 year
 - Neighborhood meetings, survey

Potential uses:

- Wildflower meadow
- Grow Zone, wildlife habitat
- Orchard
- Community garden
- Native landscaping
- Trails
- Invasive removal
- Tree planting
- Public art, outdoor education











THE BAYTON LOOP EXAMPLE

25 homes removed in 2011 after frequent flooding

- Trail
- Flood-proof amenities (benches, dog waste stations)

- Sapling planting
- Ligustrum removal
- Native seeding
- Very limited mowing
- Rain gardens

- How can we leverage new partnerships to help us reach a diverse population, and keep them engaged throughout this process?






- Targeted social media posts (FB, Nextdoor)

WPD OUTREACH SURVEY RESULTS

- Open for 28 days in November 2018
- 250 total responses
 - 50 living in, or within two blocks of, buyout area- very similar results to non-residents
 - 3 Spanish
 - 3 paper copies
 - 86 optional comments




COMMUNITY GARDENS AND URBAN AGRICULTURE






REMAINING INFRASTRUCTURE: STREETS



REMAINING INFRASTRUCTURE: LIGHTING




VEGETATION MANAGEMENT: MOWING



PRAISE AND SUPPORT

Overwhelming support of:

- Less mowing
- More street removal, closures
- Less street lights
- More pollinator habitat
- More trees
- Community agriculture
- Fruit trees
- Walking/biking/equestrian paths
- Using the area to benefit the Onion Creek ecosystem

SURVEY RESULTS

CONCERNS FROM THE PUBLIC

- Security after dark
- Homeless
- Illegal dumping
- Fallen trees, perceived lack of mowing

RESPONSE SECURITY AFTER DARK


- Frequent check-ins with APD area representatives
- Working with Legal to establish curfew via administrative rules
- Potential partnership with PARD Rangers
- Signage

RESPONSE:ILLEGAL DUMPING

- Coordinate with Austin Resource Recovery for regular sweeps
- Strategic closing of streets using boulders, gates




RESPONSE:MOWING & FALLEN TREES



- Education & communication
- Mowing buffer areas
- Utilize contracts to address "weedy" species (Johnson grass, etc)
- Biannual sweep with chipper after spring and fall storms


