

MINUTES OF THE CITY COUNCIL

Special Called Council Meeting

January 22, 1979

The meeting was called to order with Mayor McClellan presiding.

Mayor McClellan opened the Special Called Meeting, stating that this was for the purpose of canvassing the results of the Special Municipal Election held on January 20, 1979. She commented that this bond election had set a record for the number of people voting. Mr. Dan Davidson, City Manager, stated 25.45% of the registered voters had participated in the election.
