Recommendation Number 20190813-04C: Speed Management Program

WHEREAS, the City of Austin has experienced a greater than 20% increase in traffic fatalities between July 2018 and July 2019, meaning the death in traffic of a family member, friend, loved one, neighbor, or coworker about every five days;

WHEREAS, the National Traffic Safety Board found that "the relationship between speed and injury severity is consistent and direct. Higher vehicle speeds... are closely linked to injury severity," mean a decrease in speed can be the difference between life and death for crash victims;

WHEREAS, peer cities which have reduced their default speed limit to 20 or 25 mph have experienced significant decreases in crashes and fatality rates;

WHEREAS, Goal #1 of the Austin Strategic Mobility Plan chooses human safety over car throughput and gives specific direction to develop speed management guidelines: "**Prioritize the protection of human life over all else** in the planning, design, and operation of Austin's transportation network.";

WHEREAS, Imagine Austin commits the city: "...to eliminating transportation related deaths and serious injuries through a holistic Vision Zero approach";

WHEREAS, the Austin Transportation Department has received over 600 eligible applications for neighborhood speed management, but lacks the resources to fulfill these requests;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Urban Transportation Commission recommends that City Council fund Austin Transportation Department's Speed Management Program in the Fiscal Year 2020 Budget with an operating budget which allows wide-spread and robustly implemented engineering solutions and community outreach/education programs;

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, the UTC recommends that Speed Management programs include dedicated funds for both existing and future streets to achieve safe bike and pedestrian experiences.
