# HISTORIC LANDMARK COMMISSION AUGUST 26, 2019 DEMOLITION AND RELOCATION PERMITS HDP-2019-0424 5109 MANCHACA RD.

#### PROPOSAL

Demolish a ca. 1964 house and detached garage.

#### ARCHITECTURE

1-story Ranch style house with stone veneer, a side-gabled and hipped roof with composition shingles, a flat-roofed porch with decorative metal posts, and 4:4 horizontal-paned aluminum windows. 1-story detached garage with vertical composition siding and flat roof.

#### RESEARCH

The house was built by contractor Robert W. Jentsch in 1964. Jentsch lived in the house with his wife Joyce until at least 1992. Joyce's grandfather Jesse Harp also lived with the Jentsches until his death in 1969. Robert Jentsch Construction completed a variety of City projects, subdivisions, and infrastructure improvements. The Jentsch family is still active in the construction industry in and around Austin.

#### STAFF COMMENTS

The property does not appear in the 1984 Comprehensive Cultural Resources Survey.

Designation Criteria—Historic Landmark

- 1) The building is more than 50 years old.
- 2) The building appears to retain a high degree of integrity.
- 3) Properties must meet two historic designation criteria for landmark designation (City of Austin Land Development Code, Section 25-2-352).
  - a. **Architecture.** The building is constructed in a Ranch style typical of the '60s in Texas.
  - b. **Historical association**. Robert Jentsch appears to be living based on public record searches. His contributions to Austin's construction industry may warrant consideration.
  - c. **Archaeology**. The property was not evaluated for its potential to yield significant data concerning the human history or prehistory of the region.
  - d. **Community value**. The property does not appear to have a unique location, physical characteristic, or significant feature that contributes to the character, image, or cultural identity of the city, a neighborhood, or a particular group.
  - e. Landscape feature. The property is not a significant natural or designed landscape.

#### STAFF RECOMMENDATION

Encourage rehabilitation and adaptive re-use, then relocation over demolition, but release the permit upon completion of a City of Austin Documentation Package, consisting of photographs of all elevations, a dimensioned sketch plan, and a narrative history, for archiving at the Austin History Center.




