








Single Parents Struggle to Make Ends Meet—Even when Working Full Time

Under 200% of the Federal Poverty Line




A Large Percentage of Parents in Two Parent Families are not Working



Percent of Children who are School Ready








Child and Family

Children and parents/caregivers are physically, emotionally, and socially healthy.

Program and Policy

All families receive nurse home visits for newborns, and have access to negative-experience assessments, developmental screenings, and mental health consultations.

Child and Family

The community is aware of the importance of the early years and prioritizes children's development, including providing family-friendly public spaces.

Program and Policy

Civic leaders and organizations adopt, expand, and support policies and investment in high-quality early childhood programs, services, and infrastructure.

Child and Family

Families' basic needs are met, so that parents/caregivers can provide nurturing, responsive care, including talking, singing, and reading to their children every day.

Program and Policy

Families have access to universal connection and referral systems, parent education, home visits, books, and adult education and workforce development.

High-Quality Care & Education

Families

Child and Family

Children's development is fulfilled by responsive, nurturing, and engaging care either in the home, or in a licensed facility, Head Start program, or Pre-K classroom.

Program and Policy

Families have access to high-quality early-learning options that meet their needs, and early childhood educators who are well-prepared and well-paid.

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Today in Austin

14,000 babies are born in Austin/Travis County each year.

95%

of families have physical, mental, or social-emotional health needs within the first few weeks of a baby's birth.

15%

of African-American infants born in Austin/Travis County are born early, and 13% are born at low birth-weight.

1 in 5

children under 18 experience food insecurity.

The cost of high-quality infant care ranges from \$15,000 per year on Austin's east side to \$20,000 on the city's west side.

of programs serving children from household with low income are high quality.

Child care workers earn \$10.67 to \$14.07 an hour, but our city's living wage is \$15.

potential students are served by Austin ISD Pre-K3, and children from families with low income who attend Pre-K are more than twice as likely to be school ready


