# HISTORIC LANDMARK COMMISSION SEPTEMBER 23, 2019 DEMOLITION AND RELOCATION PERMITS HDP-2019-0469 1906 CANTERBURY STREET

# **PROPOSAL**

Demolish a ca. 1917 house.

#### ARCHITECTURE

One-story, rectangular-plan, front-gabled frame house with a full-width inset porch on plain, square wood posts; three-sided bay windows on each side of the central entry, each containing a central fixed-sash window flanked by a 1:1 window; 1:1 fenestration throughout the rest of the house.

# RESEARCH

The house appears to have been built around 1917; the first listing of this address in the city directories is in the 1918 edition, showing Robert M. and Grace Gage as the tenants. Robert M. Gage was the proprietor of a sheet metal business with his brother; he had previously worked for J.O. Buaas and Sons, the city's largest sheet metal contractor at the time. The Gages lived here only until around 1919, when they moved to a house on E. 1st Street (now E. Cesar Chavez Street). Mathew L. and Ellen Clark are listed as the renters of the house in the 1920 city directory; they are listed as the owners of the house thereafter. According to his obituary, Mathew Clark moved to Austin around the same time he first moved into this house; he had alternating occupations in the city directories for his tenancy in this house — he was a carpenter as well as a truck driver. After he died in 1940, Rose Ellen Clark continued to live in this house for a few more years before moving down the street to 1902 Canterbury Street.

Julia Ridings, a widow from Weir in Williamson County, purchased this house around 1942 and lived here until her death in 1955. From 1955 until around 1980, the house was owned and occupied by Pablo (Paul) and Stella Riojas. Pablo Riojas was a truck driver who established his own hauling business from this house. He and Stella moved out around 1980; Pablo Riojas died in 1997.

# STAFF COMMENTS

Despite the non-historic modifications to the house, the East Austin Historic Resources Survey (2016) still found sufficient integrity to recommend that this house be considered contributing to a potential local or National Register Historic District in South East Austin.




Staff has evaluated this house for designation as a historic landmark and has determined that the house does not meet the criteria for landmark designation as set forth in City Code:

- a. **Architecture.** The house is a ca. 1917 house that has had several modifications to the front, including the installation of non-historic fixed-sash windows and bay window configurations, as well as the expansion of the front porch from the historical partial-width configuration to a full-width porch today. The modifications to the house prevent it from being considered for individual landmark designation.
- b. **Historical association**. While the house reflects the changing demographics of this section of East Austin from the 1910s when an Anglo business owner built the house, through later working-class Anglo owners, followed by ownership by a Hispanic family who had their own hauling business here, there do not appear to be significant historical associations.
- c. **Archaeology**. The house was not evaluated for its potential to yield significant data concerning the human history or prehistory of the region.
- d. **Community value**. The house does not possess a unique location, physical characteristic, or significant feature that contributes to the character, image, or cultural identity of the city, the neighborhood, or a particular demographic group.
- e. **Landscape feature**. The property is not a significant natural or designed landscape with artistic, aesthetic, cultural, or historical value to the city.

#### STAFF RECOMMENDATION

Encourage rehabilitation and adaptive re-use, then relocation over demolition, but release the permit upon completion of a City of Austin Documentation Package, consisting of photographs of all elevations, a dimensioned sketch plan, and a narrative history, for archiving at the Austin History Center. The house does not meet the criteria for individual designation as a historic landmark.

# **BIOGRAPHICAL NOTES:**

# Robert M. and Grace O. Gage (ca. 1917 - ca. 1919)

Robert Gage appears in the 1910 U.S. census as the 22-year old son of R.A. and L.P. Gage, who lived at 1216 W. 5<sup>th</sup> Street in Austin. Robert Gage was born in Texas and was a tinner in a city shop. His younger brother, Arthur, 19, with whom he eventually started a sheet metal contracting business, was also born in Texas, and was also a tinner in a city shop. Their father, R.A. Gage, 65, had been born in Texas to a Tennessee-born father and a Kentucky-born mother, and had no occupation listed. Their mother, L.P. Gage, 46, had been born in Texas to Alabama-born parents, and had no occupation listed. Robert Gage had 6 siblings younger than Arthur: Leona, 20, an attendant in a doctor's office; James, 17; Lela, 14; Effie, 12; Lula Belle, 10 and Norah, 7. All of the children had been born in Texas. The family also had a boarder, Samuel Orman, 25, who had been born in Texas and was a streetcar conductor.

The 1920 U.S. Census shows Robert M. ad Grace Gage as the renters of the house at 1910 E. 1<sup>st</sup> Street in Austin. Robert M. Gage was 33, had been born in Texas, and was a metal worker in a tin shop. Grace Gage was 36, had been born in Texas to a Pennsylvania-born father and an Illinois-born mother, and had no occupation listed. They had 3 children: son, Marion, 8; Helen, 7; and Robert, 4. All of the children had been born in Texas.

His 1972 death certificate shows that Robert Marion Gage was living at 515 E. Riverside Drive in Austin at the time of his death. He was born in Texas in 1886 and was a retired sheet metal worker. Grave Olivette Clark Gage died in 1976. Her death certificate shows that she was born in Texas in 1883 and was a homemaker. She last lived at 509 E. Riverside Drive in Austin.

M.L. and Ellen Clark appear in the 1930 U.S. Census as the renters of this house. M. L. Cark was 60, had been born in Texas, and was a carpenter. Ellen Clark was 56, had been born in Texas, and had no occupation listed.

The 1940 U.S. Census shows Leonard M. and Rosie Ellen Clark as the renters of this house. Leonard M. Clark was 70, had been born in Texas, and had no occupation listed. Rosie Ellen Clark was 66, had been born in Texas, and had no occupation listed.

His 1940 death certificate shows that Mathew L. Clark was living in this house at the time of his death. He was born in Texas in 1870 and was a carpenter. Rosie Ellen Clark died in 1958. She was living at the Resthaven Nursing Home on N. Lamar Boulevard at the time of her death. She was born in 1874 in Texas and was a widowed housewife.

Julia Ridings was 49, had been born in Texas to a North Carolina-born father and a Tennessee-born mother and had no occupation listed. They had no children listed with them.

Thomas Ulpain Ridings died in 1935 and is buried in the cemetery in Weir, Texas. His death certificate shows that he was living in Weir, Texas at the time of his death and was a farmer. He was born in 1881 in Texas.

Her 1955 death certificate shows that Julia Ann Ridings was living at this address at the time of her death. She was born in Jollyville, Texas in 1881, and was a widowed housewife.
