## Shoal Creek Watershed

- Shoal Creek is 11 miles long
- Shoal Creek Watershed covers 13 square miles
- Headwaters at 183, empties into Lady Bird Lake
- Has 2 tributaries:
   Spicewood Springs and the
   Hancock Branch consisting of Arroyo Seco
   and Grover



### Watershed Facts

- Shoal Creek is home to a variety of wildlife, human life, commercial business and public land
- Home to the endangered Jollyville Plateau salamander
- While most people only know about Seiders Springs & Spicewoods Springs, there are 30 identified springs and seeps in the watershed
- Also home to many species of fish, birds, turtles, bats, rabbits and more.



## Watershed Facts

- 54% of the watershed is impervious surface
- Shoal Creek consistently receives a rating of "fair" in WPD's EII testing, based on water quality, sediment, aquatic life, physical integrity, contact rec, etc.

SCC Goal: consistently reach "good" in the next 20 years.




Figure 7 Shoal Creek Population Projections (COA-WPD, 2019; City of Austin Demographer, 2018; IPUMS NHGIS, University of Minnesota, 2018)


## Watershed Comparisons

## Watershed Action Plan Goal Summary:

- Achieve contact recreation standards per TCEQ
- Promote baseflow enhancement
- Reduce nutrients, herbicides, and pesticides
- Enhance riparian health
- Support City of Austin flood mitigation and planning efforts
- Seek to have Shoal Creek rated as having "Good" water quality within 20 years per the City of Austin EII program

(Creek health and water quality measured by the ongoing City of Austin EII program)
