SUBJECT: Authorize negotiation and execution of an amendment to the existing professional services agreement with PBS&J, Austin, TX, for additional design phase engineering services for the Barton Creek Lift Station Force Main Project. in the amount not to exceed \$95,814 for a total amount not to exceed \$1,767,783.

In November 2002, the Water and Wastewater Utility [now Austin Water Utility (Utility)] contracted with PBS&J to perform design phase services for the Barton Creek Lift Station Force Main Project. While performing work on this phase, additional items were identified as pertinent to completion of design tasks.

- A. Due to the fact that the project location occupies a large area of Archeological Site 41TV1364, work performed in the area requires an antiquities permit from the Texas Historical Commission (THC) in order to perform the necessary archeological investigation. When THC issued the permit for this project, the stipulation of additional small diameter corings for floatation analysis and carbon dating was requested.
- B. The Watershed Protection and Development Review Department (WPDRD) expressed concern regarding the proposed design solution, which includes the new relief main to tie into the existing 42-inch Barton Creek interceptor that traverses within about 70 feet of Eliza Spring. WPDRD

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requested:

additional borings as part of the geotechnical investigation, bore locations to be converted to monitoring wells for periodic ground water level determination, and evaluation of an alternative alignment that would keep the relief main outside the 150-ft buffer for springs (i.e., a critical environmental feature) and avoid reuse of the 42-inch pipe. WPDRD also requested boring locations.

C. Following discussions of preliminary design between PBS&J and Utility staff requested inclusion of Odor Control Facilities downstream of the proposed inverted siphon creek crossing.

This amendment will provide for the aforementioned additional design phase services.

The original participation goals of this project, which was initiated in 1994, were 10% MBE and 5% WBE. Current DSMBR Annual program goals for professional services contracts are 1.1% African-American, 5.9% Hispanic, 1.7% Native/Asian American, and 18.2% WBE.

Overall participation from the beginning including amendment: 0.7% African-American, 10.3% Hispanic, 0.6% Native/Asian-American, 15.92% WBE and 26.8% Non-W/MBE. While current program goals are not reached, original contract goals are met. Participation percentages decreased with this proposal for additional work due to the specialized nature of the work required, such as pier drilling in environmentally sensitive areas, and limited number of professionals with the ability and experience necessary to complete the work.


