



What: ATX Helps is a 501(c)(3) nonprofit charitable organization created to help address homelessness in Austin

Who: ATX Helps is a coalition of private sector stakeholder organizations, businesses, individuals and faith-based groups

Why: ATX Helps purpose is to bring private sector leadership, support and resources to fill critical gaps in the homeless service system



Three-Point Strategy:

- 1. Create 300, low-barrier, temporary emergency shelter beds with basic needs services and housing navigation
- 2. Create a facility or facilities for the storage of personal belongings with a capacity to serve 500 people
- 3. Create an outreach/family reunification program to actively connect people experiencing homelessness with their families
