SUBJECT: Authorize execution of a contract with LONE STAR BMW TRIUMPH, Austin, TX for the purchase of five police motorcycles in an amount not to exceed \$100,470.

MBE / WBE: This contract will be awarded in compliance with Chapter 2-9 of the City Code (Minority-Owned and Women-Owned Business Enterprise Procurement Program). No subcontracting opportunities were identified; therefore, no goals were established for this solicitation.

This contract is for the purchase of police motorcycles that will be assigned to the Austin Police Department (APD) for use in traffic enforcement. The City currently has 66 police motorcycles in the APD fleet. Motorcycles are used by police officers to run radar, investigate traffic accidents, and as traffic escorts for approximately 150 events per year that include parades, run fests, and political events. The motorcycles requested herein will be used to improve response time over what is possible in pursuit sedans due to quicker speed and maneuverability.

The City has been purchasing this type police motorcycles for the past few years. The motorcycles are equipped with certain design features that make it the safest motorcycle in production. The R1150RTP model is lighter and more maneuverable than other makes of police motorcycles without any loss of the heavy-duty performance from the 90 horsepower, 1130 cc twin piston engine. This motorcycle has an integral ABS braking system that provides 20% better braking performance and is not available on any other motorcycle currently in production. The integral ABS brake system links the front and rear wheel brake circuits that will apply the optimum amount of braking power to each wheel according to individual wheel load. This equates to better stopping ability without skidding. The estimated delivery time is 75 days.

The motorcycles will replace five existing bikes that have been identified by the Fleet Officer as eligible for replacement since they have 60,000 miles of wear and are no longer able to provide reliable service.

PRICE ANALYSIS

- Only bid received. This bike is equipped with the integral ABS braking system that is only provided by the manufacturer. The braking system on this motorcycle significantly reduces the possibility of skidding and loss of control for the rider; therefore, it offers the highest level of protection from injury or death to the rider and is necessary for health and safety reasons. In addition, it is lighter, faster and more maneuverable than other police bikes in production.
- Thirteen bids were issued with no MBE/WBEs available for this commodity. One bid was received. The bids were sent to dealers as well as other motorcycle manufacturers in order to get adequate competition. Potential bidders stated that they could not provide a bid at this time.
- The last purchase of this motorcycle was in January 2003 at a unit price of \$18,999. This indicates an approximate increase of 6%. The price increase is due partly to increased prices from the manufacturer for this year model. In addition, APD requested flashing light upgrades to provide for improved visibility of the motorcycle at night for rider safety.
