



DOWNTOWN AUSTIN DEMOGRAPHICS



- Millennials (ages 23-38) make up 50% of downtown residents*
- Baby Boomers are moving into downtown, increasing their share in the past few years*
- Well paid, highly educated population
- Workforce is on pace with Austin's growth rate
- Residential is triple Austin's growth rate

- Highest concentration of city's workforce is in downtown

DOWNTOWN'S GROWTH OVER THE LAST 20 YEARS




- More than 35 MSF have been developed




- Tunnel is now complete
