CITIZEN COMMUNICATION

2. REVIEW AND APPROVAL OF MINUTES

- Krystal moved to table minutes for August and September. Rennison seconded. All in favor.
- Reviewed minutes from October 2019. Glen moved to approve and Joseph seconded.

3. NEW BUSINESS: DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE ACTIONS:

- A. Presentation by RAICES, Alexander Minnaar and Adriana Quiroz, related to services provided and challenges faced by the organization and the community
 - Talked about background and services of RAICES community-based immigration legal services.
 - Legal trends seen by RAICES include: immigration forms are long and complicated; applicants fill forms by themselves and get denied due to lack of knowledge; case processing and visa availability affecting cases taking longer; applicants without an attorney are confused about immigration court days and complexity and delays add to sense of confusion; employment authorization cases have major delays; long delays on oath ceremony scheduling for citizenship; electronic monitoring/home visits/proof of presence in U.S. are seen; Remain in Mexico Program keeps people to apply for asylum outside of U.S. and it is difficult to find representation.
 - Social services needs include: housing; unaccompanied children; free or reduced fee
 counseling; transportation; enrollment in schools; in-person interpreters; needs for
 medical doctors to be educated on N-648 form, medical certification for disability
 exceptions for citizenship civics test.
 - Advocacy Department of RAICES is about a year old that advocates for immigrant friendlier policies. Local campaign examples include disseminate Know Your Rights, Immigration 101 sessions, and community meetings for advocacy.
 - Potential assistances from city council include: more resources, create spaces for people
 to be involved comfortably, educate residents how government work on a local basis, and
 having commissioners from Commission on Immigrant Affairs present at RAICES
 community meetings.



- Karen to connect RAICES with language access organizations such as CAN.
- Commissioners to make recommendation to CommUnityCare on educating about N-648.

4. OLD BUSINESS: DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE ACTIONS:

- Explore Certified Welcoming standards and Certification with Refugee Services of Texas Karen
 - Lauren Hargraves program specialist from Central Texas Office of Refugee.
 - Welcoming America having cities at local level to have welcoming and inclusive spaces for refugees and immigrants; membership (fee-based) or certification (long term goals with strategic planning at city level; requirements have to be met).
 - Currently no cities in Texas is certified.
 - Will table certification process until new staff come onboard in January; but all commissioners should review welcoming reports and standards.
- Hispanic Latino Quality of Life Commission APD forum on treatment of immigrants Karen
 - Public meeting that discusses racial profiling, police accountability, and APD relationship with ICE.
 - Hispanic Latino Quality of Life Commission would like one or two representatives from Commission on Immigrant Affairs to be present and sign up for citizen communication.
 - XXX moved to authorize Sam, Montserrat, Krystal, and Glen to represent the Commission on Immigrant Affairs at the public meeting. Kate seconded.
- Update on U visa certifications by APD, Office of Police Oversight Kate and Karen
 - 4 requests for reviews in 2019. APD didn't reverse decisions on any reviews. 2 were rejected by committee because the complaints were within policy. One was concerned about the applicant and decisions on the last case were stuck.
 - Will revisit in 6 months from now.
 - Karen turned over all materials for changes for statute of limitations to Office of Police Oversight. The office will review to determine if they will get involved.
