



Corridor-wide Mobility Improvements on all 9 corridors

- East Riverside Shore District Drive to Montopolis Drive
- South Lamar Boulevard Barton Springs Road to Treadwell Street
- William Cannon Drive Running Water Drive to McKinney Falls Parkway (CAMPO grant)
- Slaughter Lane Mopac to Brodie Lane (CAMPO grant)

INITIATE DESIGN

Enhanced Multimodal Improvements:

- Airport Boulevard North Lamar Boulevard to US 183
- William Cannon Drive Southwest Parkway to Running Water Drive
- North Lamar Boulevard Thurmond Street to Rundberg Lane





- 1. Community support


2. Quality outreach

- 8. Communication between primes and subs


