Consolidated Annual Performance & Evaluation Reports (CAPER)

- The consolidated planning process serves as the framework for a community-wide dialogue to identify housing and community development priorities that align and focus funding from the CPD formula block grant programs: Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Program, HOME Investment Partnerships (HOME) Program, Emergency Solutions Grants (ESG) Program, and Housing Opportunities for Persons With AIDS (HOPWA) Program.
- The Consolidated Plan is carried out through Annual Action Plans, which provide a concise summary of the actions, activities, and the specific federal and non-federal resources that will be used each year to address the priority needs and specific goals identified by the Consolidated Plan. Grantees report on accomplishments and progress toward Consolidated Plan goals in the Consolidated Annual Performance and Evaluation Report (CAPER).

FY 19-20 Accomplishments Snapshot

- Total number of people served through federally funded projects: 1,791
- Total number of people earning Extremely Low-Income (<30% MFI) served: 1,399
- Total number of federal dollars spent: \$13,908,316


















Median Amount of Rental Assistance






RENT Program - Demographics










RENT Program – Household Characteristics



New COVID-19 Program Funding: American Rescue Plan







- •\$22 million in additional funds for Emergency Rental Assistance
- •To be received from US Treasury
- •Will support the continuation of the City's Relief of Emergency Needs for Tenants (RENT) Program
- •\$1.5 million from the Texas Emergency Rental Assistance Program (TERAP) expected to serve 146 households



Homeless Assistance

- \$11 million from the HOME formula grant
- Will support programs targeted towards individuals experiencing homelessness, ie. Tenant Based Rental Assistance, Hotel/Motel Conversion



Emergency Section 8 Vouchers

- Emergency incremental Section 8 vouchers to transition homeless people or people at risk of homelessness to stable housing
- The ARP allocates a total of \$5 Billion emergency Section 8 vouchers
- Housing authorities must accept or decline the supplemental vouchers via a process established by HUD; HUD will reallocate declined vouchers.


- Funds intended for mortgage relief
