
celebrate and honor the diversity of our collective Latinx heritage. That heritage enriches the lives of all Austinites...."

#### **Education:**

- After-school program with Communities in Schools (CIS) started October 26
- Using Zoom, MACC instructors teach cultural arts to 20 students from Communities in Schools at these 4 sites: Bouldin Oaks, Meadowbrook, Booker T Washington, and Santa Rita.
- -EDU plans to start Spanish classes with Chupacabras, a UT graduate org.
- -EDU will host Figuralo Youth Exhibit in January 2021 to showcase student artworks virtually
- -EDU is currently currently working on the Smithsonian learning lab in creating collections around Ethnic Studies curriculum, in preparation for a Spring 2021 Conference.



## **Caminos Teen Program:**

- -11 Teen Caminos students ("caminantes") produce a bi-weekly digital variety show by Teens for Teens called Episodes 3 and 4 were released in September. ¡VAMONOS! www.bit.ly/atxvamonos @ATXCaminos.
- -The Teens presented in the National Youth Summit (digital)
- -The Teens also created an online exhibit with Austin Public Library.

## **Arts Responders**

The division awarded funds to artists that had submitted proposals to the Arts Responders project. Two Artists have been commissioned by the MACC to train in social practice, a collaborative and participatory approach to public art, then organize and engage community in an artistic response to COVID-19. The two selected are Guateque Son who will will produce a bilingual music video along with a community based Latino Musician/Artists Intergenerational PSA focused on sharing safety tips and safety guidelines for the Austin community especially targeting and connecting with the Latino community. The other artist is Jonathan Muzacz with his Be a Leader...Wear a Mask mosaic featuring an Afro-Latino female.
