







66 In the Mexican American culture, some of the siblings will stay and live close to the parents. That was pretty much the way it was for our culture, and that's what happened here on our street. My dad, four of his brothers, and two of his older nephews, when they moved into the city, they all bought houses

next to each other right on East Fifth between [what is now] Robert Martinez Street and Pedernales Street. So us kids, all of us grew up together. We didn't have to go looking for other kids because there were so many of us. s. The original owners who built this house back in 1938 were the Fisher fami-

ly, and this area was called the Fisher Gar- Mr. Limón passed away on August 16, 2020 in dens. The street was called DonAnn. In 1986, the City honored our family by naming the street; we picked Calle Limón which means Limón Street. It was my brother that said, 'let's leave it Calle Limón.'

I hope that we will start taking part and take control. You have to go to the meetings, you have to know what's going on, and you have to vote. I have a grandson who's 19, and I told him to register to vote. I usually study the leagues of people [running for office] and make my decision according to that. I try to learn as much about them and what they've done and not just come to our church when it's time for election. But I've been in meet-

ings so long and schedules so long that I don't like to participate in anything that's scheduled. I want my freedom.

But I do work and try to get young people involved. And I influence the people in the neighborhood, 'cause when I tell them something it's gonna be right, [it's] not for selfish reasons. I don't have anything to be selfish for, because if God gave me 90 years, and fun years, why should I not be free with people?




Equity-Based Historic Preservation Plan

The historic preservation plan (phase 1, 2021–22) will replace Austin's 1981 preservation plan with an inclusive, equity-focused, and community-oriented process and outcome. A working group composed of historic preservation professionals, stakeholders from allied fields, and community representatives will tackle pressing questions:

- Whose heritage is represented in designated historic properties, and what stories are missing?
- · Who benefits from preservation policies, programs, and incentives?
- How can historic preservation tools be expanded to address essential issues such as sustainability, affordability, and displacement?






