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General Purpose and Mission

- Adjust the boundary lines of the 10 singlemember districts
 - To ensure fair and equitable representation of all of Austin's residents
 - Conduct an open and transparent process enabling full public consideration of and comment on the drawing of district lines
 - Independent from influence by the city council; representative of this city's diversity
 - In compliance with Federal law and City Charter
 Article II, § 3

District Requirements

Districts shall:

- Have reasonably equal population, except as required to comply with the Voting Rights Act (VRA)
- Comply with the VRA (e.g., section 2)
- Be geographically contiguous
- As possible, respect neighborhoods and communities of interest (excl. political parties, incumbents, candidates)
- As practicable, be geographically compact
- As practicable, have geographically identifiable boundaries



Commission Make-Up

- 14 members
 - City Auditor randomly selects 8
 Commissioners from qualified pool.
 - Commissioners choose 6 more applicants from qualified pool.
 - Fully established by *March 1*



Commission Make-up

- The 6 appointees must be approved by at least five affirmative votes among the eight commissioners
- Commission must reflect the diversity of the City of Austin, including, racial, ethnic, and gender diversity
 - Formulas or specific ratios not used
- Members chosen based on relevant analytical skills and ability to be impartial
- Geographic diversity at least one commission member resides in each of the then current council districts, to the extent feasible



Next Steps

- Open Meetings Act requirements are applied
 - A quorum of your group is 5
 - May choose a chair to lead meetings
 - Mat go into executive session
- Review Applications of Qualified Pool of Applicants
 - Ratings Available from Auditor's offices
- Vote on final 6 members
