

Austin Population Growth, 1870 to 2020



Austin sees large gains while suburbs see fast growth.





Larger adult than child population, but the youngest Austinites are more diverse.








Where are Austinites from?

Share of Austin residents born in Texas has dropped from 55% to 49% in last decade.

- Share of Austin residents from other countries has remained stable at 18%.
- Biggest increase seen among Austin residents from other U.S. states, growing from 26% to 31% in last decade.






Total Population Geographic Distribution, 2010-2020






Black (non-Hispanic) Geographic Distribution, 2010-2020






Hispanic/Latino Geographic Distribution, 2010-2020






Asian (non-Hispanic) Geographic Distribution, 2010-2020
