
Austin Free-Net's Learn & Earn program is designed to increase community members' access to convenient and private digital devices while simultaneously educating participants on how to use those devices.

AVERAGE SALARIES FOR NON-PROFIT ROLES IN AUSTIN







PROGRAM MANAGER

\$88,556 annually

43% below the city average

EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

\$149,900 annually

49% below the city average

TECHNICAL INSTRUCTOR

\$53,330 annually

14% below the city average

The USD had an average inflation rate of 2.67% per year between 2016 and today, producing a cumulative price increase of 17.14%. A dollar today only buys 85.368% of what it did in 2016.

SERVICE DELIVERY - INCREASE

- Able to afford a full staff and salary increases closer to Austin averages
- Expansion of programs and offerings back to pre-pandemic levels
- Executive Director will be able to dedicate time to obtaining adequate funding resources so that Austin Free-Net can stand on its own
- Serve thousands instead of hundreds
- Meet and exceed performance measures
- Set the groundwork for the organization to thrive beyond our current contract



SERVICE DELIVERY - NO INCREASE

- Limited expansion opportunities for classes, workshops, digital navigation services with possible delays in delivery due to our current bandwidth
- Ability to reach our current performance measures will be questionable
- Executive Director and Program Manager roles will continue to take on direct service tasks to close the staffing gap

AUSTIN FREE-NET'S FUTURE GOALS

- Solidify our presence in the digital inclusion community at Net Inclusion 2023 (San Antonio)
- Secure continuous support from Big Tech in Austin for devices and funding
- Expand our services across the city with a focus on under represented zip codes
- Solidify our social media presence so we can reach more people
- Generate stable funding opportunities so that Austin Free-Net can become more independent and less reliant
- Assist a minimum of 3,000 community members annually
