







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
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AFD Positive COVID-19 Cases Includes Civil Service + Civilian





The Compliance Engine

The Compliance Engine (TCE) database tracks compliance and non-compliance for all fire protection systems in commercial properties across the City of Austin.

This allows the Austin Fire Department to track annual fire systems reports, deficiencies and repair reports and receive immediate notification of system impairments.


Office of the Fire Marshal: Special Events

- March 2022 completes a year of many events during and after Covid.
- New venues added include the Q2 Soccer Stadium and Waterloo Park Amphitheater. Numerous venue spaces created throughout the City.
- In FY22 Q1, there were 218 Special Events.



- 2022 Events
 - SXSW Spring Festival 2022
 - NASCAR
 - Moto GP
 - Q2 Soccer Stadium hosting 17 home games and 3 International games on the schedule
 - Waterloo Park with 35 concerts scheduled for this year
 - Rugby season at COTA
 - GIA amphitheater with full concert schedule this year
 - Austin Film Studios
 - Record setting pyro technical number of events
 - Weddings are back in full bloom
 - 2 dozen fraternity/sorority events during roundup this Spring
 - Hundreds of events that require review, permit processing and site visits many requiring fire watch.

Special Events is on record pace, with most of the legacy events already in the queue, including Pecan Festival, Bat Festival, Pride Festival, and Capital 10K.







AFD Wildfire Division


Acreage treated with a combination of mechanical thinning and prescribing burning:

- FY21 Q2: 435 acres treated as scheduled


AFD Wildfire Division's High Fire Danger Step Plan includes:

- Mobilization and staffing of a Wildfire Task Force that stands ready to respond and provide daily fire weather situational reports that include current state fire activity, resource deployment, and staffing
- Activation of Division GIS resources for map creation, public ● awareness, & HSEM
- Issue set-up plan recommendations, which vary based on event and may include:
 - Wildland PPE on all units
 - BTs shadow ENGs
 - Upgrade GRASS to BRUSHL and BRUSHL to BRUSH
 - Staffing select BTs
 - Staffing SF Helo Specialist
 - Staffing additional Command Element
 - Staffing WFTF

Community Outreach

The Austin Fire Department has a vision for every home and every citizen to be protected by at least one smoke alarm.

AFD's Free Smoke Alarm program offers a free smoke alarm to any resident of Austin who is in need, with the prerequisite of residing in a privately-owned home and have a genuine need for assistance.

• Number of Smoke Alarms installed:

- FY 22 Q1:	102
- FY 22 Q2:	121
