The meeting was called to order with Mayor Akin presiding.

Roll Call:

Mayor Akin announced this was a Special Meeting of the City Council called for the purpose of canvassing the returns of the Run-off Election held on May 3, 1969; and for awarding contract for traffic signal controllers at 51st - Cameron Road and I.H. 35.

Councilman LaRue moved the Council adopt a resolution showing the following votes received at the Run-off Election:

(RESOLUTION)

WHEREAS, pursuant to Ordinance No. 690407-A duly passed by the City Council of the City of Austin, Texas, a run-off election by the qualified voters of said City was held in the City of Austin on May 3, 1969, for one councilman at large for a term of two years from May 15, 1969, such councilman to be elected to and occupy a place on the City Council, such place being numbered 5; and,

WHEREAS, by virtue of said run-off election, the official returns from the election officials and the canvass thereof by the City Council, it appears that the following votes were received at said run-off election as indicated below, to-wit:

TRAFFIC SIGNAL CONTROLLERS CONTRACT 51ST - CAMERON ROAD AND I. H. 35

The Council had before it a report on installation of a traffic controller and detection system at 51st - Cameron Road and I. H. 35. Councilman Long inquired as to whose responsibility it was for controlling the traffic as she had been under the impression the Highway Department assumed this prerogative. The Traffic Engineer said the Highway Department installs traffic controls, and the City maintains and operates them under an agreement. He explained that the City maintains making signal modifications along I. H. 35, Manor Road, and also 38th Street. This program will update the signal equipment, and the modification is classified under maintenance, whereas the key word for the Highway authority is control. No. Sign or change in signal lights can be installed without the Highway Department's permission. His Department took the initiative in modifying these three programs. Councilman Long commended the City for installing this new system, as 51st and 38th Street have been very serious problems in the past.

Councilman IaRue inquired about the new timing. The Traffic Engineer explained the technicalities that would reduce the waiting periods. He reported that experiments had been made on several other instersections, and the waiting time had been reduced substantially.

Councilman Nichols moved the Council award the contract to Signal Engineering Company in the following resolution:

(RESOLUTION)

WHEREAS, bids were received by the City of Austin on May 2, 1969 for the purchase of Traffic Control Equipment for the Traffic and Transportation Department; and,

WHEREAS, the bid of Signal Engineering Company, in the sum of \$8,175.00 was the lowest and best bid therefor and the acceptance of such bid has been recommended by the Furchasing Agent of the City of Austin and by the City Manager; Now, Therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF AUSTIN:

That the bid of Signal Engineering Company, in the sum of \$8,175.00, be and the same is hereby accepted, and that R. M. Tinstman, City Manager of the City of Austin, be and he is hereby authorized to execute a contract on behalf of the City, with Signal Engineering Company.

The motion, seconded by Councilman Long, carried by the following vote:

Councilmen LaRue, Long, Nichols, Mayor Akin

Councilman Long then asked that a study be made at 23rd and Red River by the Stadium and Baseball field. She pointed out there was a traffic signal there; and suggested that south bound traffic be provided a right turn. The Traffic Engineer stated he would check this and believed this could be accomplished.

There being no further business the Council on Councilman Long's motion Councilman Nichols' second, adjourned at 11:00 A.M.
