The meeting was called to order with Mayor Palmer presiding.

MAYOR PAIMER announced this was a Special Called Meeting of the Austin City Council for the purpose of canvassing the returns of the Austin City Council Election held April 1, 1967, and of the Charter Amendment Election.

Returns of each of the 48 precincts were canvassed. Minor errors were noted in Precincts 128, 234 and 237 as pertained to the Council Election only.

WHEREAS, by virtue of an election held in the City of Austin, Texas, on the 1st day of April, 1967, for the purpose of electing five Councilmen, the official returns from the election officials and the canvass thereof by the City Council show that the following named persons severally received the total votes set opposite their names respectively, to wit:

WHEREAS, it appears that Mrs. Emma Long received a majority of all votes cast at said election for Councilman, Place No. 1; that Dick Nichols received a majority of all votes cast at said election for Councilman, Place No. 2; that Ralph Janes, Jr. received a majority of all votes cast at said election for Councilman, Place No. 3; that Harry Akin received a majority of all votes cast at said election for Councilman, Place No. 4; and that Travis LaRue received a majority of all votes cast at said election for Councilman, Place No. 5; Now, Therefore,

## BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF AUSTIN:

That in accordance with said returns, as received and canvassed, the following named persons are hereby declared duly elected and authorized to qualify for the position of Councilman for the City of Austin, for the term of two years beginning May 15, 1967:

Place No. 1 - Mrs. Emma Long Place No. 2 - Dick Nichols Place No. 3 - Ralph Janes, Jr. Place No. 4 - Harry Akin Place No. 5 - Travis LaRue

The motion, seconded by Councilman White, carried by the following vote:

Ayes: Councilmen LaRue, Long, Shanks, White, Mayor Palmer

Noes: None

Councilman LaRue offered the following resolution and moved its adoption: (RESOLUTION)

WHEREAS, on the 23rd day of February, 1967, an Ordinance was duly passed by the City Council of the City of Austin, Texas, giving notice of an election for the submission to the qualified voters of the City of Austin, Texas, at an election to be held for such purpose a certain proposition for the amendment of the existing Charter of the City of Austin; and,

WHEREAS, in accordance with law, notice of the election for the submission of such proposition at such election was given by publication in the Austin American and Austin Statesman, newspapers of general circulation published in said City of Austin, which notice was published in said newspapers on the same day in each of two (2) successive weeks on Monday March 13, 1967, and on Monday, March 20, 1967, the first of said publications being at least fourteen (14) days before the date set for said election; and,

WHEREAS, under and by virtue of the terms of the certain ordinance passed by the City Council, and approved by the Mayor of said City, on the 23rd day of February, 1967, an election was held in said City, according to law, on the 1st day of April, 1967, for the purpose of the adoption or rejection by the qualified voters of said City of said proposed amendments to the existing Charter of the City of Austin; and,

WHEREAS, upon due consideration of said election it appears and it is found that due and legal notice thereof has been given, and further upon consideration of the returns of said election it appears and it is found that the votes cast at said election have been duly counted and the returns thereof legally made, and the City Council having counted and canvassed said returns, it appears therefrom that there were cast in said election twenty-six thousand sixty-eight (26,068) votes, of which number there were cast for and against each of said propositions proposing said amendments the following:

For the Proposition: 19,694

Against the Proposition: 6,374

Majority for the Proposition: 13,320

And it appearing to the City Council from the returns of said election, after the canvass thereof as tabulated and set out above, that a majority of the qualified voters at said election have voted in favor of said amendments to the City Charter of the City of Austin, Texas, therein contained, and that the proposition proposing said amendments were approved and adopted at said election; therefore,

## BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF AUSTIN:

1. That the said proposition to adopt the amendments proposed at said election was sustained, and that at such election said amendments were approved and adopted by a majority of the qualified voters of said City voting at said election, and that the Charter amendments thereby became and are now hereby recognized and declared to be a part of the City Charter of the City of Austin, Texas, and it is so ordered.

- 2. That the Mayor and the City Manager be, and they are hereby directed, to certify to the Secretary of State of the State of Texas, an authenticated copy of said amendments, under the seal of the City of Austin, showing the approval of and adoption by the qualified voters at said election of said amendments and that the Secretary of State be requested to file and record the same in a separate book to be kept in his office for such purpose.
- 3. That the City Clerk be and is hereby directed to record at length upon the records of the City of Austin, Texas, in a separate book to be kept for such purpose, the said amendments so adopted.

The motion, seconded by Councilman White, carried by the following vote:

Ayes: Councilmen LaRue, Long, Shanks, White, Mayor Palmer

Noes:

Councilman Shanks read the following statement:

"April 3, 1967

"We have passed from the wonderful era of leadership that built this city into what it is today. I refer to the leadership given us by Mayor Tom Miller and Mayor Lester Palmer. We must recognize the simple fact that Mr. Dick Brown who owns the local newspaper made a successful power grab of the Austin City government, and now we will wait to see how this ambitious young man carries on-whether he carries on in the fine tradition as exemplified by Mayor Miller and Mayor Palmer or whether he will view the affairs of the City as something to satisfy his personal ambitions.

"The real funny thing about this successful political power grab is that Mr. Brown, who holds himself out as a staunch conservative and Republican, accomplished this coup with Ralph Yarbrough extreme liberals under the leadership and direction of Mrs. Long.

"I wish Mr. Brown the best of luck in running our City through the power of his newspaper."

There being no further business, Councilman LaRue moved that the Council adjourn. The motion, seconded by Councilman White, carried by the following vote:

Ayes: Councilmen LaRue, Long, Shanks, White, Mayor Palmer

Noes: None

The Council adjourned about 12:00 noon subject to the call of the Mayor.
