Community Health Worker

“A community health worker is a frontline public health worker who is a trusted member of and/or has an unusually close understanding of the community served. This trusting relationship enables the worker to serve as a liaison/link/intermediary between health/social services and the community to facilitate access to services and improve the quality and cultural competence of service delivery.”

The Path to the Hub

2019 – Request for Career Ladder Progression for Community Health Worker (CHW) Family.

2019/2020 – Internal plans developed to launch a CHW HUB

2021 – Reimagining Public Safety Taskforce Public Health Recommendations

August 2021 – Community Health Worker titles within the City of Austin.

August 2021 - \$500,000 in one-time funding for the creation of the CHW Network and Training.

March 2022 – Austin Public Health approved for a certification training program for Community Health Workers.

Certification for Community Health Workers

Who can be a Texas Department of State Health Services (DSHS) Certified Community Health Worker?

- ✓ Texas resident
- ✓ 16 yrs. old +
- ✓ Training
 - Class Instruction – Completion 160-hour approved class instruction
 - OR
 - Experience – At least 1000 hrs. of CHW experience

Training for CHW Certification

Option 1 - Class Instruction

- Approved DSHS training program
- 160 hours
- Virtual and In-person learning options

OR

Option 2 - Experience

- 1000 cumulative hours of community health work services
- Within last three (3) years.
- Experience verified with the supervisor(s) noted in the application.



160 hr. training course

CHW Certification Renewal

CHW Certification is renewable every two years.

To renew CHW certification with DSHS –

- Be a current Texas resident.
- Complete 20 hours of continuing education units (CEUs) every two years.
 - CEUs must be related to core competencies
 - Minimum 10 certified hours and 10 non-certified hours
 - DSHS Website – Education Calendar and online courses



CEUs Breakdown for Renewing

Certified

- 10 hrs of DSHS certified CEUs

OR

Certified

- 5 hrs of DSHS certified CEUs and
- 5 hrs of CEUs completed to renew a Texas license or certification in another health profession

+

Non-Certified

- 10 hrs of non-DSHS certified CEUs
