PROPOSAL

Demolish a ca. 1949 house and detached garage.

ARCHITECTURE

The primary building is a one-story, cross-gabled Minimal Traditional bungalow clad in asbestos shingles, with partial-width inset porch and 6:6 double-hung wood windows behind screens. The garage is a gabled one-story structure clad in board-and-batten siding.

RESEARCH

The house at 609 E. 50th Street was built in 1949 by Phillip Hoyt Adams and Nina Adams. P. Hoyt Adams worked as a linotype operator for the Von Boeckmann-Jones Company, a local printer, and served for over 40 years in Austin's Typographical Union.

PROPERTY EVALUATION


The 2020 North Central Austin historic resource survey lists the house and garage as contributing to a potential historic district.


Designation Criteria—Historic Landmark

- 1) The building is more than 50 years old.
- 2) The building appears to retain high integrity.
- 3) Properties must meet two criteria for landmark designation (LDC §25-2-352). Staff has evaluated the property and determined that it does not meet two criteria:
 - a. Architecture. The building is constructed in the Minimal Traditional style.
 - b. Historical association. There do not appear to be significant historical associations.
 - c. Archaeology. The property was not evaluated for its potential to yield significant data concerning the human history or prehistory of the region.
 - d. Community value. The property does not possess a unique location, physical characteristic, or significant feature that contributes to the character, image, or cultural identity of the city, the neighborhood, or a particular demographic group.
 - e. Landscape feature. The property is not a significant natural or designed landscape with artistic, aesthetic, cultural, or historical value to the city.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION

Encourage adaptive reuse, then relocation over demolition, but release the permit upon completion of a City of Austin Documentation Package.


