The Mayor announced that this meeting was called for the purpose of interviewing HAROLD WISE & ASSOCIATES, Planning Consultant.

MR. HAROLD WISE appeared outlining his proposal for preparing the Master Plan, and his procedure. He would provide a Senior Resident Planner to be here throughout the entire project, and Mr. Wise would be here at least once a month and more often if required.
