Regular Meeting

April 30, 1959 10:00 A.M.

Councilman White moved that WILLIAM T. Mayor Miller introduced the following ordinance:

AN ORDINANCE DECLARING THE NECESSITY FOR AND ORDERING THE PAVING AND IMPROVEMENT OF PORTIONS OF CERTAIN STREETS IN THE CITY OF AUSTIN, APPROVING PLANS AND SPECIFICATIONS FOR SUCH WORK, AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO ADVERTISE FOR BIDS, DIRECTING THE PREPARATION OF ESTIMATES, INVOK-ING THE ALTERNATE PROCEDURE PROVIDED BY ARTICLE 1, SECTION 5, OF THE CHARTER OF THE CITY OF AUSTIN AND CHAPTER 106 OF THE ACTS OF THE FIRST CALLED SESSION OF THE 40TH LEGISLATURE OF TEXAS, DETERMINING THAT THE COST OF SUCH IMPROVEMENTS SHALL BE PAID BY THE CITY OF AUSTIN, PRO-VIDING A METHOD OF REIMBURSING THE CITY OF AUSTIN FOR A PORTION OF SUCH COSTS BY ASSESSMENT OF A PORTION OF SUCH COSTS AGAINST THE PROPERTY ABUTTING SUCH STREETS OR PORTIONS THEREOF TO BE IMPROVED, AND FOR THE FIXING OF A LIEN TO SECURE PAYMENT OF SUCH ASSESSMENTS, STATING THE TIME AND MANNER PROPOSED FOR PAYMENT OF ALL SUCH COSTS, DIRECTING THE CITY CLERK TO CAUSE A NOTICE OF THE ENACTMENT OF THIS ORDINANCE TO BE FILED IN THE MORTGAGE OR DEED OF TRUST RECORDS OF TRAVIS COUNCY, TEXAS, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, the bid of Larson-Pugh, Inc. in the sum of \$10,952.48 was the lowest and best bid therefor, and the acceptance of such bid has been recommended by the Director of Public Works of the City of Austin, and by the City Manager; Now, Therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF AUSTIN:

That the bid of Larson-Pugh, Inc. in the sum of \$10,952.48 be and the same is hereby accepted, and W. T. Williams, Jr., City Manager of the City of Austin is hereby authorized and directed to execute a contract on behalf of the City of Austin with Larson-Pugh, Inc.

The Council went over the conditions set out in the resolution granting a special permit to MRS. FLORENCE E. RICHEY. Councilman Pearson stated he thought some of the conditions were unnecessary. Councilman Long offered the following resolution and moved its adoption:

WHEREAS, Mrs. Florence E. Richey has filed her application for a special permit under the provisions of Section 10-B, Paragraph 1 of the Zoning Ordinance of the City of Austin; and,

WHEREAS, the said Mrs. Florence E. Richey has appealed the action of the City Planning Commission denying a special permit for a cat and dog hospital at 1701 South Congress to the City Council; and,

WHEREAS, after due notice given to interested parties, the City Council of the City of Austin held public hearings on the matter of granting said special permit and, upon reviewing said application, has found that said application will conform to the requirements of the Zoning Ordinance of the City of Austin when the following conditions have been met:

1. The masonry fence mentioned on the plot plan shall be 6 feet high rather than 4 feet high.

2. The entire building shall be air conditioned with refrigerated air conditioning units and shall be wentilated only by the ventilation inlets provided in such air conditioning units.

3. That before operation commences the balance of the interior of the building shall be sheetrocked and the balance of the exterior and any additions thereto shall be stucco; and the entire building shall have acoustic tile installed on its ceilings.

4. That all windows shall remain closed at all times and that those windows in the south and east walls of the building shall have glass storm sashes installed over them.

5. That the operation be restricted to the operation of a veterimary hospital only, excluding boarding and kennel use.

6. That the building be altered and used in such manner that the passage of noise and odors to the outside is reduced to a minimum.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF AUSTIN:

The Council had before it for action the appeal of NELSON PUETT & ASSOCIATES regarding the width of Lightsey Road. Mr. Thomas Gee represented Mr. Puett. He stated that Mr. Puett was willing to dedicate 70' for the street if the street was not required to be more than 70' but if the street was required to be wider, then Mr. Puett would dedicate 60' which was required for his subdivision, with the city to purchase the rest. Discussion was held on whether or not this was a thoroughfare street and the subdivider would be required to dedicate 80'. The City Attorney explained that this was already a 40' street, and the subdivider would only be required to dedicate 50' to make this a 90' thoroughfare. No action was taken as the Council wanted to go over the Thoroughfare Plan and establish a policy.

WHEREAS, after an engineering and traffic investigation, the City Council has found that traffic conditions are such that an urgent need for enforcement of strict limits upon the time of parking of vehicles at the location hereinafter described upon the street makes it advisable to use mechanical devices in

enforcement, and has found that such location should be removed from Parking Meter Zone 60, and placed in Parking Meter Zone 62 as hereinbelow indicated:

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF AUSTIN:

That the location upon the street of the City of Austin as above described be and the same is hereby removed from Parking Meter Zone 60, and placed in Parking Meter Zone 62, and that the City Clerk be, and she is hereby authorized and instructed to record this finding in Section 33.43 of the Traffic Register.

Councilman Pearson offered the following resolution and moved its adoption

(RESOLUTION)

WHEREAS, the West Austin Optimist Little League has requested permission to use property owned by the City of Austin for the purpose of developing three little league baseball diamonds and other recreational facilities for use by the youth of the City of Austin; and,

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Austin has found and determined that the use of said property for the purposes of little league baseball and other sports activities by the youth of the City of Austin would be for a public purpose and in the interest of the public health and general welfare of the citizens of the City of Austin; Now, Therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF AUSTIN:

<u>PART 1.</u> That the West Austin Optimist Little League be and it is hereby authorized to use, occupy, and improve that certain portion of the Sand Beach Reserve owned by the City of Austin shown on the map or plat attached hereto marked Exhibit "A" for the purpose of developing three little league baseball diamonds and other sports activities for the use by the youth of the City of Austin.

<u>PART 2.</u> The West Austin Optimist Little League organization is hereby authorized to place upon the property hereinbefore described all improvements and facilities necessary for the development of little league baseball diamonds and other sport facilities.

<u>PART 3.</u> The City Clerk is hereby directed to file for permanent record in the office of the City Clerk copies of this Resolution.

Councilman Palmer offered the following resolution and moved its adoption:

(RESOLUTION)

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Austin has found that public necessity requires the expansion of the electric generating facilities of the City of Austin by the construction of a 100,000 kilowatt steam generating plant on the north bank of the Colorado River west of Pedernales Street; and,

WHEREAS, the City Council has found and determined that the construction and operation of said 100,000 kilowatt steam generating plant necessitates the creation, construction, and maintenance of a railroad track extending from a point in East 5th Street in the City of Austin west of its intersection with Pedernales Street southerly on Pedernales Street to the location of said steam generating plant; and,

WHEREAS, the City Council has found and determined that the hereinafter described land must be acquired in order to provide right of way necessary for the construction of such railroad track; and,

WHEREAS, the City of Austin has negotiated with the owners of such land and has been unable to agree with such owners as to the fair cash market value thereof; Now, Therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF AUSTIN:

That the City Manager be and he is hereby authorized and directed to file or cause to be filed against the owners and lienholders of such land, a suit in eminent domain to acquire fee simple title for said purposes to the following described tract of land:

> 0.095 of one acre of land, same being out of and a part of that certain portion of Outlot 10, Division 0 of the Government Outlots adjoining the Original City of Austin, Travis County, Texas, according to a map or plat of said Government Outlots on file in the General Land Office of the State of Texas; which was conveyed to B. O. Willhoite et ux Irene Willhoite by the following three (3) Warranty Deeds:

(1) Dated February 11, 1943 of record in Volume 707 at page 624 of the Deed Records of Travis County, Texas.

(2) Dated March 18, 1942 of record in Volume 694 at Page 284 of the Deed Records of Travis County, Texas.

(3) Dated August 17, 1942 of record in Volume 706 at Page 347 of the Deed Records of Travis County, Texas; said 0.995 of one acre of land being more particularly described by metes and bounds as follows: BEGINNING at a galvanized pin set at the point of intersection of the south line of East 5th Street, same being the north line of the said B. O. Willhoite et ux tract of land, with the curving northeast line of the herein described tract of land said curve having an intersection angle of 90° 12' a radius of 271.45 feet and a tangent distance of 272.40 feet, and from which point of beginning the northeast corner of the said B. O. Willhoite et ux tract of land bears S 67° 14' E 108.80 feet;

THENCE, with the said curving northeast line of the herein described tract of land along a curve to the right an arc distance of 149.24 feet the sub-chord of which arc bears S 24° 24' E 147.36 feet to a galvanized pin set in the east line of the said **B**. O. Willhoite tract of land same being the west line of Pedernales Street;

THENCE, with the east line of the said B. O. Willhoite tract of land $$23^{\circ}$ 14' W 48.04 feet to a galvanized pin set in the curving southwest line of the herein described tract of land said curve having an intersection angle of 90° 12' a radius of 249.45 feet and a tangent distance of 250.32 feet;

THENCE, with the said curving southwest line of the herein, described tract of land along a curve to the left an arc distance of 233.66 feet the sub-chord of which arc bears N 26° 04' W 225.20 feet to a galvanized pin set in the north line of the said B. O. Willhoite tract of land same being the south line of East 5th Street;

THENCE, with the morth line of the said B. O. Willhoite tract of land S 67° 14' E 61.86 feet to the point of beginning.

The motion, seconded by Councilman Pearson, carried by the following vote Ayes: Councilmen Long, Palmer, Pearson, White, Mayor Miller Noes: None

The Council had before it the request of Sheriff T. O. Lang for six (6) parking spaces on the west side of Guadalupe in front of the County Courthouse to be reserved for the Sheriff's Department. Councilman Long moved that the six (6) spaces be granted. The motion, seconded by Councilman Pearson, carried by the following vote:

The Assistant City Manager reported that 30 or 40 members of the Alice Chamber of Commerce were making a tour and would be in Austin Thursday, May 7th and would visit the Council Meeting and the Council was invited to have lunch with them.

Councilman Long stated that the LULAC CLUB had rented the Coliseum for May 5th and they would like to have permission to decorate it the night before.

The Council informally agreed to grant the permission and Mr. Blodgett was asked to call Mr. Vickers.

The Assistant City Manager brought up a request from Buck Avery to hang a banner across Congress Avenue from May 1 to May 12. Councilman Long moved that the permission be granted subject to supervision of the City Manager. The motion, seconded by Councilman White, carried by the following vote:
