Jan-Jun 2004

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Crime in Austin

Jan-Jun 2004

Overall, serious crime is down 1.7%

- ◆ 22,031 Part I Index crimes from Jan Jun 2004 compared to 22,420 from Jan Jun 2003
- ◆ Overall decrease driven by a reduction in burglaries and burglaries of vehicles



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Crime in Austin

Jan-Jun 2004

Violent Crime

- ◆ 1,690 violent crimes from Jan Jun 2004 compared to 1,534 from Jan - Jun 2003
- ♦ Increase of 156 reported crimes or about 10%

16 Homicides through June 2004compared to 14 in 2003

- In 3 of the cases, the crime was committed in a prior year but the victim died in 2004
- ♦ Of the 13 crimes committed in 2004:
 - 12 have been solved....92% clearance rate
 - 4 involved domestic violence
 - 8 involved an acquaintance
 - 1 case under investigation...relationship unknown
 - 2 victims were children, 12 and 13 years old



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135 Rapes through June 2004compared to 104 in 2003

- 26 rape of a child cases, compared to 36 last year
- 71% of the victims knew their assailant
- 23% of the victims had a brief encounter with the assailant
- 4% of the assailants were strangers
- 2% of the cases, the relationship is unknown
- No indication of any serial rapists active in recent months
- 39 Hispanic victims in 2004 compared to 49 in 2003

679 Robberies through June 2004compared to 565 in 2003

- ♦ 50-60% of robbery victims are Hispanic
- Recent increase in serial robberies
 - 2/3 of all robberies were committed by a few individuals/groups
 - Example- 5 young men committing 11+ robberies in one week
- ◆ 30 banks robbed compared to 4 in 2003
 - 77% of the bank robberies have been cleared compared to the national average of 36%



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872 Aggravated Assaults through June 2004compared to 850 in 2003

- ◆ 22% of the aggravated assaults in 2004 were related to family violence
- ◆ The percentage of family violence assaults was up to 40% for several months in 2001
- ◆ 34% of the aggravated assault victims did not know their assailant - up from 29% in early 2003
- ◆ 10% of aggravated assaults resulted in an injury to a child



Violent Crime Action

- ◆ Reallocating additional resources to Career Criminal and FBI Violent Crime Task Force
- ◆ Increased bilingual & other Detectives in Robbery
- Area Commands establishing anti-robbery programs



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Violent Crime Action

- ◆ Sex Offender Apprehension & Registration (SOAR)
 check on accuracy of addresses
- ◆ Continue Emergency Protective Order home visits to reduce family violence
- Initiate home visits of abused & neglected children to enforce court issued safety orders
- Strictly enforce laws regarding sale & consumption of alcohol to minors





Crime in Austin Jan-Jun 2004

Property Crime

- ♦ 20,341 property crimes from Jan Jun 2004 compared to 20,886 from Jan - Jun 2003
- ◆ Overall decrease driven by reduction in burglaries and burglaries of vehicles

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Property Crime Jan-Jun 2004

- 3,264 burglaries compared to 3,680 in 2003
 - Residences down 1%; storage facilities down 70%; businesses down 6%
- 15,654 thefts compared to 15,824 in 2003
 - burglaries of vehicles make-up more than ½ of all thefts
 - 3% reduction in burglaries of vehicles
 - · 21% reduction in shoplifting
- 1,423 auto thefts compared to 1,382 in 2003
 - · Chevy/GMC pick-ups and SUVs most likely to be stolen

Property Crime Action

Truancy reduction

- Cooperation among AISD, APD and other law enforcement agencies
- ♦ Key elements of the program
 - . Return kids to school during the day
 - Establish a juvenile center for chronic truants & youth with warrants
 - Connecting social service programs with chronic truants



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Property Crime Action

- Property Crimes Unit
 - Started in November 2003
 - · Unit has dismantled 3 major fencing rings
 - · Continued focus on the receivers of stolen property
- ◆ Auto Theft reduction
 - · Bait car program fully implemented
- Increased use of Forensics in less serious property crime cases

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
2004 Traffic Update (Jan-Jun)


Since January, an average of five persons per month have died on our roadways

- ◆ The youngest was 14 and the oldest was 90
- ◆ Half of our fatalities involved drugs or alcohol

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2004 Traffic Update (Jan-Jun)

The Austin Police Department employs a threepronged strategy for addressing traffic safety:

- **♦** Enforcement
- ◆ Education
- ◆ Engineering



2004 Traffic Update (Jan-Jun)

- Enforcement strategies are developed through:
 - accident location analysis
 - · citizen complaints
 - · officer's observations
- Purchased equipment to enhance officers' ability to enforce traffic and DWI laws
 - Breath Alcohol Testing bus
 - · Stealth cars
 - Radar
- ◆ Grants used to fund increased enforcement- \$612,000 in FY04



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Enhanced DWI Enforcement

- ♦ New officers train with the DWI Unit
- ◆ Increased overtime staffing
- More aerial support locating DWIs on freeways and throughways

General Traffic Enforcement

- ◆ Stealth vehicles to identify aggressive drivers
- ◆ Variety of vehicles provided by local car dealers parked to disguise an officer using radar
- ◆ Increased media access to real-time collision information and enforcement target locations



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Public Education

- ◆ Public services announcements: two ready and
 6 in the planning stages
- ◆ Billboards and newspaper ads
- ◆ Provide local colleges, high schools and military posts with educational materials
- ◆ Alcohol stings: inform the media about businesses that sell or furnish alcohol to minors



Individual Accountability

- Don't Drink and Drive
- Don't allow a friend to drink and drive
- Slow down and obey all signals and traffic signs
- Wear your seatbelt



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Traffic Management

Role of the Commander over traffic safety management:

- Lead APD's participation in partnership with TxDOT,
 City/County transportation departments, Capital Metro and other related agencies
- Implement improved officer training on how to reduce traffic congestion
- ◆ Coordinate APD input on roadway engineering and traffic signal control
- Oversee traffic education efforts including the production of public service announcements
