SUBJECT: Authorize execution of a 12-month service agreement with AAA FIRE & SAFETY EQUIPMENT CO., INC., Austin, TX, for new fire extinguishers, repair parts and recharge, repair, testing, and inspection services in an amount not to exceed \$63,371, with two 12-month extension options in an amount not to exceed \$63,371 per extension option, for a total agreement amount not to exceed \$190,113.

AMOUNT & SOURCE OF FUNDING: Funding in the amount of \$47,528 is available in the Fiscal Year 2004-2005 Approved Operating Budget for various City Departments. Funding for the remaining three months of the original contract period and extension options is contingent upon available funding in future budgets.

FISCAL NOTE: There is no unanticipated fiscal impact. A fiscal note is not required.

PURCHASING: Lowest bid of four bids received.

MBE / WBE: This contract will be awarded in compliance with Chapter 2-9 of the City Code (Minority-Owned and Women-Owned Business Enterprise Procurement Program). No subcontracting opportunities were identified, therefore, no goals were established for this solicitation.

This contract establishes a service agreement to provide new fire extinguishers, recharge existing fire extinguishers, repair parts and services, as well as inspection and testing of City owned equipment. This contract is necessary to ensure that all extinguishers, whether inside a City building or mounted in a City vehicle, are checked on an annual basis. The annual inspection will include a thorough examination of mechanical parts, extinguishing agent, and expelling means. Hydrostatic testing is required every five to twelve years depending on the type of extinguishing agent. Stored pressure extinguishers are required to be emptied and recharged every six years.

The major departments using this contract are Austin Energy (20%), Austin Water Utility (17%), Finance & Administrative Services Department - Building Services Division (15%), Aviation Department (12%), Solid Waste Services Department (7%), Parks and Recreation Department (9%), Fleet Services Division (6%), Austin Public Library (6%) and Austin Convention Center Department (3%). Six other City departments will be included in the contract at a lower percentage of use for a total of 15 City departments on this contract.
