
In 1998, the City annexed approximately 1122 acres in the Del Valle area for limited purposes on a non-consensual basis. The limited purpose annexation statute requires property to be converted to full purpose status unless the property owner waives the conversion requirement.

In 2001 the City converted all but approximately 6.4 acres at the end of Jet Lane (a 10 foot wide County ROW) to full purpose status. The area not converted to full purpose status is comprised of two lots; 2.5 acres owned by John Empy and 3.6 acres owned by William Schkade. John Empy lives on his property and William Schkade has a vacant house on his property. Because of the difficulties associated with providing full municipal services to these properties, it was decided not to annex those two tracts for full purposes.

William Schkade has requested that his property be disannexed from the limited purpose jurisdiction. Upon review of this area, city staff is recommending that the entire 6.4 acres at the end of Jet Lane be released from the limited purpose jurisdiction. Mr. Empy has been notified that his property is being recommended for disannexation from the limited purpose jurisdiction.



ORDINANCE NO.

AN ORDINANCE ADJUSTING THE CITY OF AUSTIN'S BOUNDARY LIMITS BY DISANNEXING FROM THE LIMITED PURPOSE JURISDICTION APPROXIMATELY 7 ACRES OF LAND OUT OF THE SANTIAGO DEL VALLE GRANT IN TRAVIS COUNTY, TEXAS.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF AUSTIN:

PART 1. Findings.

- (A) Texas Local Government Code Section 43.142 authorizes the City to disannex an area in accordance with the City's Charter. The City's Charter, Article I, Section 6 provides that the City may disannex an area after public hearing.
- (B) Notice of two public hearings concerning the disannexation of the territory described in Exhibit A were published in a newspaper of general circulation in the City of Austin, Texas, on the City of Austin internet website, and in the area to be disannexed.
- (C) The public hearings were held on April 7, 2005 and April 14, 2005, both at 6:00 p.m. in the City Hall Council Chambers, 301 W 2nd Street, Austin, Texas. The public hearings were concluded after providing an opportunity for all persons present to be heard with respect to the proposed disannexation.
- PART 2. The boundary limits of the City are amended to exclude, and the City of Austin disannexes and releases from its limited purpose territory, approximately 7 acres of land out of the Santiago Del Valle Grant, in Travis County, Texas, as more particularly described in Exhibit A attached to and incorporated as part of this ordinance.
