# Purchasing Service Agreement CITY OF AUSTIN RECOMMENDATION FOR COUNCIL ACTION

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SUBJECT: Authorize execution of a 12-month service agreement with PHILIP RECLAMATION SERVICES, Houston, TX, for packaging, transportation, and disposal of household hazardous waste collected at the Household Hazardous Waste Collection Facility, in an amount not to exceed \$325,900.75, with three 12-month extension options in an amount not to exceed \$325,900.75 per extension option, for a total contract amount not to exceed \$1,303,603.

AMOUNT & SOURCE OF FUNDING: Funding in the amount of \$108,634 is available in the Fiscal Year 2004-2005 Approved Operating Budget of the Solid Waste Services Department. Funding for the remaining eight months of the original contract period and extension options is contingent upon available funding in future budgets.

FISCAL NOTE: There is no unanticipated fiscal impact. A fiscal note is not required.

**PURCHASING:** Lowest bid of two bids received.

MBE / WBE: This contract will be awarded in compliance with Chapter 2-9 of the City Code (Minority-Owned and Women-Owned Business Enterprise Procurement Program). No subcontracting opportunities were identified; therefore, no goals were established for this solicitation.

This contract establishes a service agreement for packaging, transportation and disposal of household hazardous waste collected at the Household Hazardous Waste Collection Facility (HHWF) for the Solid Waste Services Department. This program provides an environmentally safe and convenient means by which to dispose of unwanted chemicals such as pesticides, herbicides, paints, solvents, auto care products and cleaning agents. The contractor will perform all work in accordance with the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality and the Code of Federal Regulations concerning household and small business hazardous waste. All disposal sites utilized by Philip Reclamation Services are licensed by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency and/or the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality.

The City of Austin opened the first permanent facility in Texas for the collection of household hazardous wastes in October 1991. This program was expanded in 1995 to incorporate the collection of these wastes with those generated by small business classified as Conditionally-Exempt Small Quantity Generators. This program provides an environmentally safe and convenient means by which to dispose of unwanted chemicals such as pesticides, herbicides, paints, solvents, auto care products and cleaning agents.

The HHWF is located at 2514 Business Center Drive. The facility is open on Tuesdays and Wednesdays from noon until 7:00 P.M., and by appointment. Since the program's inception in 1986, approximately 8.0 million pounds of hazardous waste have been properly managed; approximately 90,000 residential

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households have utilized disposal services and recycling, and about 1,750 small businesses have been helped with disposal and recycling. All of this waste was diverted from going into the City's area municipal landfills.
