The applicant, Julie Fouillet, owner of Pacha Coffeehouse, requests a waiver from the minimum distance requirement of 300 feet in Section 4-9-4(A) of the Austin City Code because she intends to sell alcoholic beverages at her business which is located 77 feet from a public school, Texas School for the Blind and Visually Impaired, at 1100 West 45th Street.

Section 4-9-5 allows the City Council to waive the 300 feet distance requirement if they determine that enforcement of the distance requirement in a particular instance:

- (1) is not in the best interest of the public;
- (2) constitutes waste or the inefficient use of land or other resources;
- (3) creates an undue hardship on an applicant;
- (4) does not serve its intended purpose;
- (5) is not effective or necessary; or
- (6) for any other reason the council, after consideration of the health, safety, and welfare of the public and the equities of the situation, determines is in the best interest of the community.

Section 4-9-5(B) provides that the City Council may consider a written consent to the waiver of the 300 feet distance requirement provided by each church, public school, public hospital, day-care center or child-care facility within 300 feet of the proposed place of business to be sufficient justification for the waiver. Written consent to allow the waiver has been received from Dr. Phil Hatlen, Superintendent of Texas School for the Blind and Visually Impaired.

## REQUEST:

The applicant, Ms. Julie Fouillet, requests a waiver from the minimum distance requirement of 300 feet in Section 4-9-4(A) of the Austin City Code in order to sell beer and wine at an existing restaurant. The development is located at 4618 Burnet Road, which is 77 feet from an existing public school, Texas School for the Blind and Visually Impaired, at 1100 W. 45<sup>th</sup> Street.

Section 4-9-5(A) allows the City Council to waive the 300-foot distance requirement if they determine that enforcement of the distance requirement in a particular instance:

- (1) is not in the best interest of the public;
- (2) constitutes waste or the inefficient use of land or other resources;
- (3) creates an undue hardship on an applicant
- (4) does not serve its intended purpose
- (5) is not effective or necessary; or
