<u>SUBJECT</u>: Authorize negotiation and execution of an amendment to the professional services agreement with MALCOLM PIRNIE, INC., Austin, TX, for additional program management consulting services for water and wastewater services to annexed areas in the amount of \$851,000 for a total contract amount not to exceed \$12,209,824.33.

In April 1997, the City of Austin entered into an Agreement with the Participants (Davenport Ranch MUD, Eanes I.S.D., U.S.A.A. Stratum Executive Center Joint Venture, Opus South Corporation, Riverbend Baptist Church, Hill Partners, Protestant Episcopal Church/St. Stephens Episcopal School) to provide the Participants wastewater service. The Loop 360 Lift Station Project was created in order to convey the wastewater generated by the Participants into the City of Austin collection system. On December 31, 1997, the Davenport Ranch MUD was annexed into the City of Austin.

The design plans and specifications for the original project were prepared and submitted for review by the City of Austin, Texas Water Development Board (TWDB), Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT) in June 2000. The review of the original Project by the City and TxDOT revealed several issues that raised concerns regarding the Project's ultimate ability to be constructed and operated in an efficient manner. Therefore, the Loop 360 Lift Station Project was modified, and the outcome of the Feasibility Study resulted in several design changes to the scope of the Project including:

• Participants will pay their portion of the fee for the Agreement and have turned the design and construction of the projects over to the City of Austin. The Agreement also transformed the responsibility for Project Management and Contract Administration to the City of Austin. Additionally, the City of Austin sold some of their shares to another Participant, the Nalle tract, geographically located near Riverbend and USAA Stratum Properties. The City of Austin has an



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executed Agreement with the Participants to take over the Loop 360 Lift Station Project, in accordance with council authorization on November 15, 2001.

- The proposed Davenport Lift Station was moved to a location near the maintenance facility for Austin Country Club golf course. This would allow the existing WWTP to be decommissioned. An 18" gravity effluent line, constructed via horizontal directional drilling (HDD), from the existing WWTP will be extended to feed the proposed lift station.
- From the proposed Davenport Lift Station, the most feasible method for transmitting flow from the Davenport Ranch subdivision to the Crosstown Tunnel was via Horizontal Directional Drilling (HDD) underneath Lake Austin. HDD has been proven to be a reliable construction method through a previous water line construction underneath Lake Austin, as part of the 1997 Annexation Program. It is anticipated that the wastewater force mains will have single steel casing pipes with two high density polyethylene (HDPE) carrier lines and possibly additional utilities may be transmitted within the casing pipe.
- A water line segment upgrade from 12-inch to 24-inch has been included in accordance with the City of Austin Water Master Plan to improve service flow and pressure to the west side of Austin.

The above modifications resulted in the Davenport Wastewater Improvements Projects, two projects, which have subsequently been contracted for with new Design Consultants, previously authorized for Jacobs Engineering, Inc. and LAN, Inc., and are currently at the 60% design submittal phase. Additionally, these modifications resulted in the following components of the Project to be located within the Austin Country Club golf course:

- Construction of a lift station
- Demolition of the existing Davenport Ranch WWTP
- Construction of various pipelines.

The City is currently in negotiations with Austin Country Club for easements in accordance with council authorization on November 20, 2003.

As part of the 1997 Annexation Program, Malcolm Pirnie, Inc. served as the Program Manager for the City of Austin throughout the various design phases of the projects and negotiations with the Participants and Austin Country Club. In July 2002, Malcolm Pirnie, Inc. was contracted for program management services and to act as the Project Manager for the final design projects that came out of the Feasibility Study. Interface and coordination with Austin Energy, Austin Country Club, Texas Water Development Board, and Participants is also included as part of the program management services.



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This RCA requests authorization of additional funding for two task items, in the estimated amount of \$851,000.00. The first task item includes program management services for the construction of the Davenport wastewater and water improvements projects. The wastewater projects consist of the Loop 360 Lift Station and one gravity line and two wastewater force mains using horizontal direction drilling. The water line project upgrades the water system to a 24-inch water line to replace an existing 12-inch water line at the intersection of RM 2222 and Loop 360. The Participants Agreement, which allows the participants to opt out of the agreement, pay their contribution for service, and allow the City of Austin to fully manage and direct the work for the Loop 360 Lift Station, has been signed and all parties have paid contributions.

This authorization includes public involvement, permitting assistance, inspection and construction management services for the two Davenport Wastewater Improvements projects. Inspection services will be provided jointly by the City's Construction Inspection Division and private inspection.

The second task item is for limited program management services associated with the City's ongoing services to annexed area program. This includes the technical review of 60% and 100% plan and cost opinion submittals for four (4) design projects for ongoing Service to Annexed Areas projects.

Assuming no unforeseen circumstances, it is intended this will be the final authorization request for this professional services contract. Phasing of obtaining authorization of the design and construction phase services for the Davenport wastewater and water projects was required due to (1) the determination of when construction would commence (based on real estate acquisition, completion of Agreement with Participants, and required construction sequencing) and (2) determining that City construction inspection staffing would be available at the time construction commences due to the extensive number of construction projects occurring within the City.


