SUBJECT: Authorize negotiation and execution of a 12-month service agreement with TMA SYSTEMS, Tulsa, OK, for the purchase of a Computerized Maintenance Management System in an amount not to exceed \$112,500, with two 12-month extension options to expand the program for additional licenses and maintenance in an amount not to exceed \$15,800 for the first extension option, and \$30,800 for the second extension option, for a total agreement amount not to exceed \$159,100.

AMOUNT & SOURCE OF FUNDING: Funding in the amount of \$80,000 is available in the Fiscal Year 2003-2004 Operating Budget of the Department of Aviation. Funding in the amount of \$42,500 is included in the Fiscal Year 2004-2005 Approved Operating Budget for Department of Aviation. Funding for the extension options is contingent upon available funding in future budgets.

This contract provides an automated, off-the-shelf Computerized Maintenance Management System (CMMS) software package. It includes implementation and maintenance services to be performed by the Department of Aviation Maintenance and Facilities Operations Divisions at the Austin-Bergstrom International Airport (ABIA).

The CMMS will be used to log, track, monitor, maintain, and report maintenance related activities as required to be in compliance with FAA standards and regulations with regard to: operating procedures, facilities and equipment, responsibility assignments, and any other information needed by personnel concerned with operating the airport. The use of this software will also increase efficiency and reduce overall costs of maintenance activities on the airport property. The current software product has limited functionality. It does not offer external automated notifications to ABIA tenants, labor costing, automated inventory tracking, or reporting.

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Maintenance and Facilities Operations includes Facility Services, Building Maintenance, and Field Maintenance divisions. Maintenance and Facilities Operations' responsibilities range from the maintenance of fields and runways to the terminal and parking lots, to the perimeter fences. Its hours of operations are 24 hours a day, 365 days a year. The Facility Services Division is responsible for cleaning the terminal and outlying office buildings, which cover approximately 2,228,000 square feet. The Building Maintenance Division is responsible for the maintenance and repair of the ABIA campus buildings and the airfield lighting systems. These systems include electrical, heating, ventilation and air conditioning (HVAC), equipment /electronic technicians, building maintenance workers, plumbing and central plant operation. The Field Maintenance Division is responsible for the motor pool, landside, and airfield maintenance. Motor pool tasks include vehicle and preventative maintenance on site.
