AMOUNT & SOURCE OF FUNDING: Funding in the amount of \$107,240 is available in the Neighborhood Housing and Community Development (NHCD) Department Special Revenue Fund, the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG - 30th Year). The initial contract period for the Interlocal Agreement will be October 1, 2004 – September 30, 2005. Funding for renewal options is contingent on performance and available funding in future budgets.

Background:

The City's Consolidated Plan 2005-2009 identified affordable child care as a high priority public service need.

A Notice of Funding Availability (NOFA) was published in the <u>Austin American-Statesman</u> on June 1 and June 7, 2004, requesting competitive applications for the Teen Parent Child Care program. Seven applications for the Teen Parent Child Care program were received and scored. AISD is one of three organizations that were awarded contracts for the Teen Parent Child Care program. Authorization for the other two contracts is being requested in a separate RCA.

Parents participating in the Teen Parent Child Care program must be low-income teenagers who are attending middle school or high school. Emphasis of the program will be placed on providing high-quality infant and toddler child care, parent training, and monitoring of teen parent attendance and performance in school. The program will provide child care at four AISD High Schools: Crockett, Johnston, Reagan, and Travis.
