This action authorizes the negotiation and execution of a professional services agreement with Colette Holt & Associates, a consulting firm experienced with different procurement programs in the U.S. Colette Holt will manage a project that will produce a series of statistical studies and ancillary reports addressing MBE and WBE procurement programs, including those of the City of Austin. The action expands on the direction that was provided by the City Council in June, to continue to strengthen the M/WBE ordinance and procurement program.

The "Second Generation Study" addresses issues raised by the M/WBE Council Subcommittee including surveying the disparity between M/WBE usage in the private and public sectors. The study will also produce information that will assist the City to ensure that its procurement program is properly designed and based on the market conditions that exist within our marketplace.

The proposed studies will examine disparities in business formation, business owner earnings, and wage/salary earnings in the private sector between women, racial and ethnic minorities, and non-minorities in the U.S. as a whole, the state of Texas, and the Austin-Round Rock (formerly Austin-San Marcos) Metropolitan Statistical Area (MSA). Additionally, the studies will review utilization of MBE/WBEs by local jurisdiction without programs. Finally, it is anticipated that the Consultant will gather program input from both MBE/WBEs and non-MBE/WBEs by conducting focus groups and public hearings to collect anecdotal evidence about their experiences, successes and difficulties in obtaining prime contracts and subcontracts in the Austin area.

Professional Services Agreement CITY OF AUSTIN RECOMMENDATION FOR COUNCIL ACTION

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This agreement will produce studies to assess the effectiveness of MBE, WBE and DBE programs in our community.
