## BOARD AND COMMISSION ACTION: N/A

In 2004, Watershed Protection and Development Review Department (WPDRD) staff conducted an inventory of properties containing underground storage tanks (UST). The UST properties were identified and GIS mapped for tracking purposes. The status of 66 UST properties appear to be unknown or abandoned.

Approval to apply for this \$200,000 Brownfields Assessment Community-Wide Petroleum grant is being requested to offer the property owner's an incentive for environmental site assessments on their property to determine the status of the UST properties and ultimately lead to the cleanup of brownfields.

The United States Environmental Protection Agency (US EPA) has partnered with the City of Austin since 1998. The WPDRD is requesting council authorization to apply for the Brownfields Assessment Community-Wide Petroleum Grant to further the city's commitment to sustainable community development. Guided by the principles of sustainable community development, the Brownfields Program will allow the city to reinvest in the community through the appropriate reuse of existing underutilized urban brownfield properties.
