The City currently has an interlocal agreement with Travis County Emergency Services District Number 4 (TCESD #4) for the District to provide firefighting and EMS first response services to areas within the City that are closer to the District than the existing City fire facilities. The District responds to the calls in that area and provides services until the City fire and EMS crews arrive.

TCESD #4 has developed a training program for firefighter certification for their department and other county fire departments. A class of fifteen individuals began on 10-18-04. This agreement will provide City funding in the amount of \$30,000 to provide salaries to the District trainces during their training. Additionally, TCESD #4 is acquiring additional funding from Travis County and funding from private sources. This agreement contributes to the City's social equity goals by providing recruit trainces and their families with opportunities and resources to be self-sufficient.

The training provided will qualify the recruits for certification as firefighters.

The Austin Fire Department will benefit from this effort. Initially, the addition of these District trainees in providing initial firefighter certification training will improve fire response services in those areas where the District delivers these services to the City. Additionally, graduates of this training program could be eligible to apply with the Austin Fire Department.

This agreement is for the term of the training program of approximately six months. Upon completion of this contract, future funding for this initiative will no longer be provided by the Title IV-A Health and Human Services Dept. Special Revenue Fund.
