This contract is for the purchase of an ANDROS Wolverine bomb robot vehicle with tabletop controller assembly, 1200 feet of fiber optic cable, and camera pan/tilt assembly for the Austin Police Department Explosive Ordinance Team (EOT).

The ANDROS Wolverine robot will pull a Large Vehicle Bomb Disruption Cart (high energy access disablement device) remotely. The Cart carries three 55 gallon plastic drums filled with water and a small explosive charge which are used to separate explosive components within a large suspect vehicle.

The EOT currently has two Remotec Mini-ANDROS II Robots. These mini-robots are not capable of lifting/towing large and/or heavy items; therefore APD requires this larger robot capable of additional lifting and towing capacity. The attachments and tools for the Mini-ANDROS II robots are compatible with those used for the Wolverine. Because these attachments and tools are compatible, APD can eliminate the purchase of some accessories that are normally purchased with the robot, creating fiscal and operational efficiencies. With interchangeable equipment, APD's options for field response are increased with the least amount of funds required.

This agreement is entered into under the provisions of the Interlocal Cooperation Act, Chapter 791, Texas Government Code.
