**PURCHASING:** Low bid of five bids received.

<u>MBE / WBE:</u> This contract will be awarded in compliance with Chapter 2-9 of the City Code (Minority-Owned and Women-Owned Business Enterprise Procurement Program). No subcontracting opportunities were identified; therefore, no goals were established for this solicitation.

This contract is for the purchase of one truck-mounted 150-foot aerial device. The truck chassis is manufactured by International and the body is manufactured by Bronto Skylift. The aerial device will be assigned to the Austin Energy, Overhead Transmission Division. This truck is necessary to support crews to construct and maintain electrical transmission lines. Most of this work is performed on high towers fabricated of structural steel members that are located in rough terrain, which requires long reach capability and lifting capacity. The flatbed body is equipped with various tool boxes and tie downs to accommodate the transport of hardware, insulators, and tools utilized in daily operations.

This truck will replace an existing 1984-year model truck and meets the Fleet Officer's eligibility criteria for replacement. The Service Center Manager has inspected the truck to be replaced and determined that the mileage or hours of use cannot be increased without risking a significant increase in repair costs and loss of productivity due to down time.

There are currently no manufacturers supplying gasoline engines for this size truck chassis. The truck is powered by a diesel engine that meets the Federal Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) guidelines for emissions. To legally sell the engines, the engine manufacturer must meet the incremental requirements established by the EPA for each year model. The City is buying diesel with the lowest sulfur content available on the market. There are no alternative fuel options for the application.
