The meeting was called to order, with Mayor Miller presiding.
Roll call
Present: Councilmen Alford, Bartholomew, Gillis, Mayor Miller - 4 Absent : Councilman Wolf - 1

Present also: Walter E. Seaholm, Acting City Manager; J. E. Motheral. Oity Ingineer; J. M. Patterson, Acting City Attorney; and R. D. Thorp, Chief of Police.

The minutes of the Regular Mecting of May 25, 1944, were read, and upon motion of Councilman Alford were adopted as read by the following vote:

The REVERHND W. M. ANDERSON, colored, came before the Council and requested permission to move the Pilgrims Home Baptist Church building locat_ ed at 902 West 25 th Strect to another location; and submitted an offer to sell the City the lot on which said building is now located.

It was the sense of the meating that the offer to sell the City the lot in question be declined; and that the matter of moving the church building be referred to the City Engineer for attention.

The following report of the Board of Adjustment on the change in zonIng of the premises at 1502 Lavaca Street was received:
"Austin, Texas May 31, 1944

Honorable Mayor and City Council

Gentlemen:
The following is a copy of a resolution which was passed by
the Board of Adjustment at a meeting on May 30, 1944:
RESOLUTION•

WHERTAS, the City Council of the City of Austin, pursuant to the terms of Section 31 of the Zoning Ordinance of the City of Austin, has referred to the Zoning Board of Adjustment for its consideration a petition of Dr. Robt. W. Shipp requesting a change in the Use designation of the following property:

A part of Lot 5, Block 38, of the Original City of Austin, Texas, being No. 1502 Lavaca Street, portions of an oxisting builaing occupied by a commercial use;
from "C-1" Commercial District to "C-2" Commercial District; and
WHRREAS, on March 6, 1944, the above owner filed an appeal with the Board of AdJustment for a variation of the Zoning Ordinance to permit a liquor store to be installed in a portion of the above building, which eppeal was withdrawn on motion of the Board that it was without jurisdiction under the law to grant such a variation; and

WHargas, the owner subsequently filed an application with the City Council for a change in the zoning classification in this said portion of the said premises which was referred to the Board for consideration and recomendation; and whereupon the Board passed a resolution and submitted the same to the Council recommending against this change; and

WHEREAS, thereafter upon notice of a public hearing, the Council did change the zoning classification of this portion of the building, contrary to the recommendations of the Board, at a regular meeting of the City Council; and

WHERRAS, this portion of the building now appears on the zon ing maps of the City of Austin as a spot zon which is not boing used for the purpose appealed for as acknowledged by the owner in this application; and

WHPREAS, this second application is for a change of another portion of the same building for the same purposes as stated in the original application, which portion is now occupied by a legal comercial use; and

WHBREAS, the Board again carefully considered this application in connection with its offect on the property, conformance with the terms of the Ordinance, and relation to a comprehensive zoning plan for the City of Austin; and

WHEREAS, the Board deoms that all of the conditions and circumstances and reasons set out in the original resolution recommending against the former change apply oqually to the present application; now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF ADUSTMENT:
THAT the change of this specific portion of the property
requested in the application be not recommended to the $C_{i}$ ty Council; and that the $C_{i}$ ty Council be urged to deny the application for the following principal reasons:
(1) THAT the Board desires to again mphasize the fact that this application is for a change of only a portion of a lot of rocord and a part of the building, which does not properly define the boundaries of the changed use area in accordance with the requirements of the Ordinance, which stipulates that the boundaries of zoning districts shall be cither streets, alleys or property lines;
(2) THAT this change will create another spot zone unrelated to any general zoning plan for this District, or in answer to any public demand or change in trend of land use in this area;
(3) THAT, in general, spot zoning for any purpose is contraxy to the purpose and spirit of the Ordinance, and, if continuously indulged in, will evontually break down the Zoning Ordinance, and basically is a grant of special privilege to a property owner as against the interests of the pubiic under the philosophy of the Zoning law;
(4) That in this particular case the premises are now legally occupied and the present tenant would have to be ovicted for the sole purpose of making available the premises for a new tenant, presumably for an increase in rent, which financial consideration has not been declared to be a valid cause for zoning changes by the courts of the land;
(5) THAT it is inconceivable to assign any measure of hardship on the owner should this appeal be denied inasmuch as the owner is not dependent upon the rental of this property for this purpose for his economic security;
(6) THAT after a long period of study for the control of the liquor traffic through the Zoning Ordinance, the $C_{i}$ ty Council established a "C-I" District, which permits the sale of wine and beer in approved cafes and restaurants, in addition to the existing "C-2" District, in which liquors of all types may be sold to the public, and Lavaca Street after due public notice and hearing was zoned as a "C-I" Commercial District, making it possible for the cafes and restaurants located thereon to serve wine and beer with their meals, but excluding spirituous liquors, at which time all property owners had ample opportunity to be heard concerning their ow properties;
(7) THAT the granting of this appeal would let down the bars completely and permit the establishment of open saloons, package stores and the sale of spirituous liquors to the public in these particular spots while prohibiting this privilege to the other property owners in this zone.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF ADJUSTMENT:
THAT inasmuch as the original spot zone granted by the $C_{o}$ uncil
in the first portion of the building is not now occupied for the purpose applied for, the Council is urged to rescind its former action and place this portion of the building back into the "C-1" District in harmony of the use classification of the property on Lavaca Streat.

Pursuant to published notice thereof, this being the day and the hour for the public hearing on the proposal of the City Council to amend the Zoning Ordinance in the following particulars, towit:

To amend Subsection (e) of Section 18 of that certain ordinance passed and approved by the City Council of the $\mathrm{C}_{i}$ ty of Austin, Texas, July 17, 1941, being a general revision of the Zoning Ordinance of the City of Austin, which ordinance is recorded in Book "L", pages 152-174, of the Ordinance Records of the City of Austin, so as to change the last two words "as required" to "of three (3) feet. "

To amend Subsection (a) of Section 19 of that certain ordinance passed and approved by the City Council of the City of Austin, Texas, July 17, 1941, being a general revision of the Zoning Ordinance of the City of Austin, which ordinance is recorded in Book "L", pages 152-174, of the Ordinance Records of the City of Austin, so as to change the words "forty feet", in the last line to "forty per cent ( $40 \%$ )."

To amend the USR designation of the following described property so as to change same from "c-1" Commercial District to "C-2" Commercial District: A portion of Jot 5, Block 38, Original City, known as 1502 Lavaca Street, in the City of Austin, Texas;
the Mayor thereupon announced the hearing open.
The following persons were then heard for and against the proposed change in the USS designation of the property known as 1502 Lavaca Strect:

DR. ROBT. V. SHIPP, proponent, represented also by his agent, J. I. HARRISON, appeared in support of the proposed change.

MRS. J. \#. IINDEMAN, represented by MRS. CARRIE TODD and J. O. GARRETT; and S. W. MATHIS appeared and protested the proposed change.

Written requests of $A, D, B O L M$ and R. G. MURLLER that the entire block on Lavaca Street between 15 th and 16 th Streets be changed instead, were received.

There being no other objectors desiring to be heard; and all those present having been given a fair and impartial hearing, the hearing was thereupon closed.

There being no objectors present to be heard on the proposed change In the text of the Zoning Ordinance, this hearing was also thereupon closed.
