Mayor Glass announced the purpose of this meeting was to discuss the new building program and to get it started. There was a detailed discussion as to which architects would be employed for the different buildings, in an effort to equally distribute the City business among the different architects in the city. Representatives from the firms Giesecke, Kuehne and Brooks; C. H. Page and Son; Page, Southerland and Page, were called in to work out an agreement between the three as to the architectural services for the Police and Courts Building. It was stated that the Coliseum work had been granted to Fehr and Granger; The Hospital additions to the three firms Niggli & Gustafson; Giesecke, Kuehne & Brooks; and C. H. Page & Sons. The Council vanted to distribute the different projects to the various architects in Austin.
