MINUTES OF THE CITY COUNCIL

CITY OF AUSTIN, TEXAS

Regular Meeting

June 5, 1952 10:00 A.M.

Council Chamber, City Hall

The meeting was called to order with Mayor Drake presiding.

Roll Call:

Present: Councilmen Johnson, Long, MacCorkle, White, Mayor Drake Absent: None

Present also: W. E. Seaholm, City Manager; W. T. Williams, Jr., City Attorney; C. G. Levander, Director of Public Works.

Councilman White moved that the Minutes of the last meeting of the Council be approved. The motion, seconded by Councilman Johnson, carried by the following vote:

The City Manager submitted the following Memorandum to the Council:

"Subject: Southwestern Bell Telephone Company rates and Services in Annexed Areas

"The Southwestern Bell Telephone Company, through its Manager, Mr. I. W. Davis, has assured us that all customers of the Telephone Company in the newly annexed areas will be billed at rates applicable in the the City of Austin. Credit will be given to all such subscribers for any excess rates retroactive to December 20, 1951.

"Service facilities will be increased as soon as facilities can be provided. At the present time there are some eight party lines in the annexed areas. These will be changed to four party or less, in accordance with their franchise agreement, as fast as their plant can be expanded to take care of it."

MR. FRENSLEY felt that the amount charged was not so objectionable as the inability to get private lines and four-party lines. It was stated public hearing was to be held on the Telephone Company's request for increase in rates, and Mr. Frensly was welcome to come to the hearing.

MRS. PAUL R. TUTT, 1907 Madison, (Crestview addition,) asked for help on the drainage problem in that territory, stating the people were not satisfied with the City's proposal to make a ditch through their property. She stated Mr. A. B. BEDDOW had offered to drain the area at his own expense. Mr. Beddow was asked to come to the meeting; and after his arrival the matter was discussed in detail. Mr Beddow stated he would put in a ditch, but not a 15'x9' ditch as proposed by the Engineering Department. He stated he would do the grading, but he would not put in any culverts. The City Manager stated this drainage was a responsibility of the subdivider, and it would not be up to the city to subsidize the drainage areas The matter was referred to the City Manager to work out with Mr. Beddow and the Director of Public Works.

MR. PERRY JONES, represented Mr. E. R. Schieffer on a drainage problem on Mr. Schieffer's property near the airport south of the park property, where there is a natural creek, but where filling station water is carried down this creek. He did not feel that the City should let this water be drained off on Mr. Schieffer's property. The Director of Public Works said there was no way of draining this water without going to a great expense. Mr. Jones said he would be back next Thursday to see if any plan had been worked out.

MR. ANDREW T. BAILEY made inquiry about his zoning application for change of zoning at 1805 E. 14th. This application was nowpending in the Zoning Commission and no recommendation was before the Council.

The Mayor brought up the following ordinance for final passage:

Councilman Long presented a petition from residents in Homewood Heights Addition, bordered on the north by Twelfth Street; on the south by the Webberville Road; on the west by Hargrave Street and Rosewood Avenue; and on the East by East Harvey Street, asking for an adequate supply of city water. Councilman Long moved that the City Manager be instructed to move out on this as soon as possible. The motion, seconded by Councilman White, carried by the following vote:

Councilman Long submitted a petition reading as follows:

We, the undersigned Citizens, and Tax Payers of Austin, Texas, do hereby request the extension of the South Austin-South First Street Bus from the point of South First and West Live Oak, turn south to Cumberlain Road., turn west to South Fourth, turn north to Herndon Lane, turn west to South Fifth, turn north to the usual turn on West Annie.

Councilman Long moved that this petition be referred to Mr. Greig, Austin Transit Company, and that he take it up with these people and try to serve the greatest number of the people and work it out with them, and have Mr. Greig report to the Council by letter as to how he took care of it. The motion, seconded by Councilman White, carried by the following vote:

Councilman Long submitted a petition requesting street lights in certain sections of Oak Ridge Heights, especially in the areas that are wooded (2003 Block South Fifth to the 2500 Block, and from the 2000 Block of South First to the extreme end of South First; Corners of Oak Crest and Herndon Lane; Oak Crest and Cumberlain Road; Herndon Lane and South Fourth, and other points along South First and South Fifth) Councilman Long moved that this be referred to the City Manager to make a study of it and see if those people can be given some lights. The motion, seconded by Councilman Johnson, carried by the following vote:

Discussion of the Thoroughfare Paving Program was held with reference to including sidewalks in four units along with the paving program. Councilman MacCorkle felt that by adding the sidewalk to the paving, the paving program might be slowed down. MR. JOE CORWIN, Brown and Root, stated he thought it would make a difference in signing up the property owners, and felt if the two programs were separated that the paving program would be more successful; and that a few of the paving units would be lost if the sidewalk program was tied in with it.

Councilman Long moved that the ordinance declaring the necessity for and ordering the paving and improvement of 19 units, introduced May 15, 1952, be tabled. The motion, seconded by Councilman White, carried by the following vote:

The Mayor then introduced the following ordinance:

AN ORDINANCE DECLARING THE NECESSITY FOR AND ORDERING THE PAVING AND IMPROVEMENT OF CERTAIN STREETS OR PORTIONS THEREOF IN THE CITY OF AUS-TIN, APPROVING PLANS AND SPECIFICATIONS FOR SUCH WORK, AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO ADVERTISE FOR BIDS, DIRECTING THE PREPARATION OF ESTIMATES, INVOKING THE PROCEDURE PROVIDED BY ARTICLE XXIV OF THE CITY CHARTER AND CHAPTER 106 OF THE ACTS OF THE FIRST CALLED SESSION OF THE 40TH LEGISLATURE OF TEXAS, DETERMINING THAT A PART OF THE COSTS SHALL BE BORNE BY THE CITY AND THAT A PART SHALL BE BORNE BY THE ABUTTING PROPERTIES AND THE OWNERS THEREOF. PROVIDING FOR THE ASSESSMENT OF THE PORTION OF THE THE COSTS TO BE BORNE BY PROPERTY OWNERS, AND FOR THE FIXING OF A LIEN TO SECURE PAYMENT OF SUCH ASSESS-MENTS, STATING THE TIME AND MANNER PROPOSED FOR PAY-MENT OF ALL SUCH COSTS, DIRECTING THE CITY CLERK TO CAUSE A NOTICE OF THE ENACTMENT OF THIS ORDINANCE TO BE FILED IN THE MORTGAGE OR DEED OF TRUST RECORDS OF TRAVIS COUNTY, TEXAS, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

The ordinance was read the first time, and Councilman Long moved that it be passed to to its second reading. The motion, seconded by Councilman White, carried by the following vote:

Noes: Councilman MacCorkle, with the statement he thought the two pro-

grams should be separated.

The Mayor stated an opinion had been received from the City Attorney, Opinion No. 52-25, dated June 4, 1952, Application for Dock Permit on Walsh Property, regarding the application of TED G. WALSH for a boat dock, and public hearing on this matter was set for Thursday, June 12th.

Councilman Long moved that the City Manager be asked to contact our present auditors, and hire them if possible under the same specifications. The motion, seconded by Councilman MacCorkle, carried by the following vote:

Councilman White stated there had been a misunderstanding about the furnishing of linen and laundry to the firemen. He stated the firemen understood if they had linens furnished they would have to share beds, and they wanted their own bed. The City Manager stated it was his recommendation that when they had to share the beds, as they do at the Central Fire STation, they would be furnished fresh linen each day; but in some of the other stations, they have their own individual beds. He stated the City now was trying to furnish individual beds in each case, and he had a report from the Fire Department that they preferred having their own beds.

Councilman White inquired about the sewer line out in the south part of town to the Ward Body Works. Mr. Jones of the Engineering Department outlined the program of this project.

Discussion was held on the recommended pay raises for city employees. Councilman MacCorkle moved that this be considered in Executive Session. The motion lost for want of a second.

The Mayor introduced the following ordinance:

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THAT CERTAIN ORDINANCE ENTITLED: "AN ORDINANCE ADOPTING AND ESTABLISHING A WAGE AND SALARY PLAN AND SCHEDULE FOR OFFICES AND EMPLOYMENTS OF THE CITY OF AUSTIN; DEFINING THE SCOPE OF THE WAGE AND SALARY PLAN; CREATING THE WAGE AND SALARY COMMITTEE; PROVIDING FOR THE CONTROL OF WAGE AND SALARY ADMINISTRATION; PROVIDING A SAVING CLAUSE, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY," WHICH ORDINANCE WAS PASSED BY THE CITY COUNCIL JULY 12, 1951, AND IS RECORDED IN BOOK "Q", PAGES 363-370 OF THE ORDINANCE RECORDS OF THE CITY OF AUSTIN, TRAVIS COUNTY, TEXAS, IN SUB-SECTION (3) (a) OF SECTION 5 THEREOF, RELATING TO THE MASTER WAGE-SALARY SCHEDULE; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

The ordinance was read the first time, and Councilman MacCorkle moved that the rule be suspended and the ordinance passed to its second reading. The motion seconded by Councilman White, carried by the following vote:

On truck tube repairs only Austin Goodyear is low at a next total of \$2020.00, Starr Kealhofer is next at \$2031.50. If Starr Kealhofer is awarded the contract for truck tires and tubes, it is recommended that the tube repair be included as it would be of interest to the City to have the tube repairs in the same place as the tube contract. This practice has been followed in the past.

On vulcanizing, retread and repairs of tires, all list prices are practically the same. Willie Kocurek is low at 40% discount from list. It is recommended that Willie Kocurek be offered the contract for recapping, etc. He formerly had this contract and does excellent work.
