MINUTES OF THE CITY COUNCIL

Regular Meeting

October 2, 1952 10:00 A.M.

Council Chamber, City Hall

The meeting was called to order with Mayor Drake presiding.

Roll Call:

The Council greeted six students from Baker Junior High School.

MRS. FRED EBY appeared again to discuss the property which the City will need for the Water Plant. She was willing to give $2\frac{1}{12}$ acres to the City in exchange of the City's constructing the road across her property. She was anxious that the Planning Department and Engineering Department work this problem out with her immediately. The Mayor felt that nothing could be done until the Water Plant Property had been planned, and this would be accomplished in about two weeks. Councilman Long moved that Mrs. Eby's offer be submitted to the Planning Department and lawyers for study to see if it is feasible to go out and lookat the possibility of building that road and see if it will cost the same for building the road as the cost of the property. Councilman MacCorkle offered the following resolution and moved its adoption:

(RESOLUTION)

WHEREAS, E. Ahlgrimm has made application in writing for permission to operate a doctor's office and clinic for human beings only on the rear of Lot 1, Block 27, of the Original City of Austin, Travis County, Texas, the same being on the east side of Nucces Street and locally known as 1805 Nucces Street, and is located in a "B" Residence District which requires a special permit from the City Council; and

WHEREAS, this application has been considered and approved by the City Council of the City of Austin, therefore

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF AUSTIN:

THAT permission for the operation and maintenance of a doctor's office and clinic for human beings only be granted to E. Ahlgrimm with the following conditions:

- 1. That this clinic be used in the general practice of medicine, and that no mental or psychiatric patients be housed in such clinic.
- 2. That all regulations required in this zone and all building code provisions be complied with in the operation and maintenance of such building.

Councilman Long offered the following resolution and moved its adoption: (RESOLUTION)

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF AUSTIN:

THAT the City Council of the City of Austin hereby approves as a filling station site the property located at the southeast corner of the intersection of Anderson Lane and Burnet Road which property fronts 164.85 feet on Anderson Lane and 99.64 feet on Burnet Road, and being known as a portion of the George W. Spear League in the City of Austin, Travis County, Texas, and hereby authorizes the said J. A. Birdwell to construct, maintain, and operate a drive-in gasoline filling station and to construct curbs, ramps and sidewalks in conjunction therewith, subject to the same being constructed in compliance with all ordinances relating thereto, and further subject to the foregoing attached recommendations and plans; and the Building Inspector is hereby authorized to assue an occupancy permit for the operation of this filling station after full compliance with all the provisions of this resolution, and said permission shall be held to be granted and accepted to all necessary, reasonable and proper, present and future regulations and ordinances of the City of Austin, Texas, in the enforcement of the proper police, Traffic and Fire regulations; and the right of revocation is retained, if, after hearing, it is found by the City Council that the said J. A. Birdwell has failed and refused and will continue to fail and refuse to perform any such conditions,

regulations, and ordinances.

"Dear Sir:

"We, the undersigned, have considered the application of J. A. Birdwell for permission to construct, maintain and operate a drive-in gasoline filling station and to construct commercial driveways in connection therewith upon the property located at the southeast corner of the intersection of Anderson Lane and Burnet Road which property fronts 164.85 feet on Anderson Lane and 99.64 feet on Burnet Road and being known as a portion of the George W. Spear League in the City of Austin, Travis County, Texas, and the property upon which this filling station is to be located is owned by J. A. Birdwell and we hereby advise that the following conditions exist.

"The property upon which this filling station is to be located is designated as "C" Commercial Use District upon the zoning maps of the City of Austin.

"There are no storm water drainage facilities in place adjacent to this property. The storm sewer and surface drainage from this filling stationisto be disposed of in such a menner that such water and other surface drainage will not flow across the sidewalk area into the street.

"We recommend that J. A. Birdwell be granted permission to construct, maintain and operate said drive-in gasoline filling station and to construct curbs, ramps and sidewalks in conjunction therewith, subject to the following conditions:

- "(1) That all buildings and equipment shall be placed inside of the property line, correct lines to be obtained before construction starts or equipment is installed. Lines and grades to be obtained from the Department of Public Works for entrances and driveways, building lines to be approved by the City Building Inspector. That the applicant shall confer with the Department of Public Works as to future grades of the sidewalks and gutters on the adjacent streets before he starts any construction relative to the filling station.
- "(2) That only underground tanks shall be used and that all pumps shall be so located that it will be impracticable to service motor vehicles therefrom while said motor vehicles are standing on any part of a sidewalk, street or alley.
- "(3) That the gasoline tanks, pumps, and all equipment used in connection with the storage and handling of gasoline shall be an approved type and shall bear the label of Underwriters Laboratories, Inc., and that all construction of the filling station improvements shall be in accord with the Building Ordinance, the Zoning Ordinance, the Filling Station Ordinance, and in accordance with the ordinance prohibiting the disposal of commercial water or oils upon the City Streets.
 - "(4) That the grades of the station shall be such that no waste water or

oils or any floor washings shall ever pass over the City sidewalk area and that all of said oils and water shall be concentrated into a combined grease and sand trap which shall be constructed in accordance with our standard plan 2-H-146.

- "(5) That all filling station improvements, pump islands, drive-ways, ramps, gutters, sidewalks and curbs shall be constructed of concrete at the expense of the applicant as set forth upon the plan hereto attached, which plan bears the Department of Public Works file number 2-H-1122.
- "(6) Expansion joints shall be constructed as shown upon the plan hereto attached marked 2-H-1122 and shall be of the pre-mounted type.
- "(7) When the owner considers that he has complied with all the requirements of the City of Austin for filling stations, he shall apply for a final inspection and upon approval, the Building Inspector shall issue a Certification of Operation before such filling station can be put into service.

THAT the Southwestern Bell Telephone Company be and the same is hereby permitted to construct its underground telephone conduit in the following streets:

(1) An underground telephone conduit in LIGHTSEY ROAD, from a point 175 feet east of Clawson Road easterly 1143 feet, the centerline of which underground telephone conduit shall be 2 feet north of and parallel to the south property line of said LIGHTSEY ROAD.

THAT the work and construction of said underground telephone conduit, including the excavation of the streets and the restoration and maintenance of said streets after said underground telephone conduits have been constructed, shall be under the supervision and direction of the City Manager and in

accordance with the ordinances and regulations of the City of Austin governing such construction.

MR. DARBY HAMMOND, 1505 Pasadena Drive, representing citizens in Crestview, Violet Crown, and Sky View, protested the locating of a fan marker by the C.A.A. in this area. He did not believe the efforts of the C.A.A. to cut down interference with the Television reception had been successful, and he did not think anything short of removing the fan marker would be satisfactory to the people in this area. He suggested moving it to the Magnesium Plant area. The Mayor asked for more time to go into this matter. Councilman Long suggested he contact our U. S. Congressman and Senator. Mr. Blodgett stated he had tried to contact one of the representatives from the C.A.A., but had been unable to do so; however, the C.A.A. was trying to do something about it.

The Council greeted MR. DAVID RODRIQUEZ, Tax Assessor of Puerta Rica.

MR. ED CLARK asked when he could get some information about the time of the hearing on the Owsley report. The Mayor had contacted Mr. Clinton Owsley, who was very busy at this time, but Mr. Owsley had told him as soon as he could, he would let the Mayor know.

No action was taken on the application of SIGMA PHI EPSILON ALUMNI CORP. for nursery school at 2610 Rio Grande. The Administrative Assistant stated a study of the nursery schools and convalescent homes is being made and will be ready for the Council by next week. The Council deferred this application until next week.

MR. RUSSEL FISH, Consulting Engineer, 2401 Windsor Road, noted the section of Lamar Boulevard between 24th and 29th had become hazardous due to the unbanked curves, and that the speed limit in that particular area had been reduced. He asked that since this hazard knowingly exists that parking in this area be prohibited. MR. R. P. WAGNER, 2410 Pemberton Parkway, also asked that no parking be allowed. The Council felt a recommendation from the Planning and Zoning Commissions on parking on thoroughfares and off-street parking wuld be forthcoming soon.

Councilmen White presented a complaint from citizens living at the intersection of the Old Cameron Road with the Interregional Highway. These citizens report that cars coming into the Highway come in on the wrong side of the street, and run up on the curbs and lawns. He asked if some kind of a sign couldn't be placed out there. The matter was turned over to the City Manager to get some signs placed.

Councilman MacCorkle had written to Memphis for a copy of their Antinoise ordinance, and he stated he would send each member of the Council a copy when he received this one.

Councilman Long inquired about the proposed amendment to the Zoning text having been published for public hearing before Council members had read it.

There being no further business, the Council adjourned at 11:15 A.M., subject to the call of the Mayor.
