MR. WILLIE KOCUREK and MR. IRBY CARRUTH represented the Schools, and explained their situation and their needs for \$7,000,000 bond money, and the nearness to their top tax level of \$1.50 that they are approaching. They felt that if the valuation were set at .80%, they would be well under the statutory rate. After a very detailed discussion of the Schools' position and the City's position with reference to selling more bonds, Councilman MacCorkle moved that the City Attorney prepare an ordinance setting the rate for 1952 at 75% assessed valuation as follows:
