The meeting was called to order, with Mayor Miller presiding.

The reading of the Minutes was dispensed with.

An appeal by R. C. Wilson, Attorney for Tom S. Castillo, on his client's application for a wine and beer dealer's permit for the premises known as E. G. BAR, 317 East 6th Street, recommended for denial, was heard. After considering the facts in the case, it was moved by Councilman Glass that the permit be granted. Hardy Hollers, Attorney for Mrs. Bessie Menem, came before the Council and asked for a rehearing on his client's application for a change in zoning of property at 509 Pedernales Street, being Lot 6, Morseland Place, Outlot 11, Division "A", from "E" Heavy Industrial District to "C-1" Commercial District, and being the same property on which the City Council on June 12, 1947, voted to sustain the action of the Board of Adjustment and deny a like change; and in support of his petition, alleged there were circumstances in the case which would justify the reopening of the matter. The matter was referred to the City Attorney for legal opinion.

Arthur DeWitty, Colored, came before the Council and submitted a written memorandum from the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People.

charging racial discrimination against Negroes at Brackenridge Hospital and inadequate emergency service, and asking for the removal of Leonard Bulomewitz from its emergency staff. Protestant further charged racial discrimination and inadequate treatment in the case of a Negro man who was fatally wounded in an affray in the 1600 block of Rosewood Avenue. Both matters were referred to the City Manager for investigation.

The application of M. H. VI. Action of the Board: Not Recommended

For the following reasons:

1. There is a commercial zone now on Airport Boulevard and 48th Street, and if the property in question is zoned for "C" Commercial uses there will be a skip of a block and a half between the existing business zone and the new zone and thereby creating a spot zone.
2. The majority of the present community centers along Airport Boulevard are undeveloped at this time and provide ample space for business expansion necessary to serve the needs of this area.
3. The appellant's property consists of 1 lot and a portion of another lot left after the right-of-way was obtained for Airport Boulevard, and there is now a residence on this property fronting on 49th Street. Since all of the lots are laid out parallel to the Boulevard, therefore, it is questionable whether there is suitable space behind the present dwelling for a commercial business setting back 25 feet from the boulevard property line. It is essential that this setback line be preserved along all major thoroughfares and boulevards in the City.

W. SPEAR LEAGUE IN TRAVIS COUNTY, TEXAS, SAID LOTS BEINGS NOS. 11 THROUGH 37, BOTH INCLUSIVE, AND NOS. 57 THROUGH 74, BOTH INCLUSIVE, NOS. 17 AND 18 AND THE EAST PORTION OF LOT NO. 119; A 34.03 ACRE TRACT OUT OF OUTLOTS 53, 54, AND 59, DIVISION A, OF THE GOVERNMENT TRACTS ADJOINING THE CITY OF AUSTIN IN TRAVIS COUNTY, TEXAS, ALL OF WHICH LAND AND TERRITORY LIE ADJACENT TO AND ADJOINING THE PRESENT LIMITS OF THE CITY OF AUSTIN IN THE PARTICULARS STATED IN THE ORDINANCE.

Councilman Thornberry offered the following resolution and moved its adoption:

(RESOLUTION)

WHEREAS, Texas Public Service Company has presented to the City Council tentative maps or plans showing the proposed construction of its gas mains in the streets in the City of Austin hereafter named, and said maps or plans have been considered by the City Council; therefore

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF AUSTIN:

THAT Texas Public Service Company be and the same is hereby permitted to lay and construct its gas mains in and upon the following streets:

- (1) A gas main in CHESTNUT AVENUE, from a point 65 feet north of New York Avenue southerly 153 feet, the centerline of which gas main shall be 12 feet west of and parallel to the east property line of said Chestnut Avenue.

Said gas main described above shall have a cover of not less than $2\frac{1}{2}$ feet.

- (2) A gas main in WEST ANNIE STREET, from a point 259 feet west of Newton Street westerly 232 feet, the centerline of which gas main shall be 10 feet south of and parallel to the north property line of said West Annie Street.

Said gas main described above shall have a cover of not less than $2\frac{1}{2}$ feet.

- (3) A gas main in EAST 14TH STREET, from Walnut Avenue to Ulit Avenue, the centerline of which gas main shall be 7.5 feet south of and parallel to the north property line of said East 14th Street.

Said gas main described above shall have a cover of not less than $2\frac{1}{2}$ feet.

- (4) A gas main in ULIT AVENUE from East 14th Street to East 17th Street, the centerline of which gas main shall be 6.5 feet west of and parallel to the east property line of said Ulit Avenue.

Said gas main described above shall have a cover of not less than $2\frac{1}{2}$ feet.

- (5) A gas main in EAST 17TH STREET from Ulit Avenue to Miriam Avenue, the centerline of which gas main shall be 7.5 feet south of and parallel to the north property line of said East 17th Street.

Said gas main described above shall have a cover of not less than $2\frac{1}{2}$ feet.

- (6) A gas main in WATSON STREET from Taulbee Street southerly 348 feet, the centerline of which gas mains shall be 7.5 feet west of and parallel to the east property line of said Watson Street.

- (7) A gas main in ZENNIA STREET from a point 286 east of Guadalupe Street easterly 232 feet, the centerline of which gas main shall be 7.5 feet south of and parallel to the north property line of said Zennia Street.

Said gas main described above shall have a cover of not less than $2\frac{1}{2}$ feet.

- (8) A gas main in ZENNIA STREET from a point 182 feet west of Leralynn Street easterly to Leralynn Street, the centerline of which gas main shall be 7.5 feet south of and parallel to the north property line of said Zennia Street.

Said gas main described above shall have a cover of not less than $2\frac{1}{2}$ feet.

- (9) A gas main in LERALYNN STREET from Zennia Street southerly 72 feet, the centerline of which gas main shall be 7.5 feet west of and parallel to the east property line of said Leralynn Street.

Said gas main described above shall have a cover of not less than $2\frac{1}{2}$ feet.

- (10) A gas main in CEDAR STREET from a point 74 feet south of East 19th Street northerly 40 feet, the centerline of which gas main shall be 9 feet west of and parallel to the east property line of said Cedar Street.

Said gas main described above shall have a cover of not less than $2\frac{1}{2}$ feet.

- (11) A gas main in EAST $53\frac{1}{2}$ STREET from Bennett Avenue westerly 192 feet, the centerline of which gas main shall be 7.5 feet south of and parallel to the north property line of said East $53\frac{1}{2}$ Street.

Said gas main described above shall have a cover of not less than $2\frac{1}{2}$ feet.

- (12) A gas main in FLETCHER STREET from Forest Avenue westerly 96 feet, the centerline of which gas main shall be 11.5 feet south of and parallel to the north property line of said Fletcher Street.

Said gas main described above shall have a cover of not less than $2\frac{1}{2}$ feet.

- (13) A gas main in EAST $2\frac{1}{2}$ STREET, from a point 73 feet east of Canadian Street easterly 187 feet, the centerline of which gas main shall be 7.5 feet south of and parallel to the north property line of said East $2\frac{1}{2}$ Street.

Said gas main described above shall have a cover of not less than $2\frac{1}{2}$ feet.

- (14) A 9' x 7' x 7' CONCRETE REGULATOR PIT in Chicon Street, the centerline of the 7' axis to be 7.5 feet west of and parallel to the east line of Chicon Street and the centerline of the 9' axis to be 15 feet north of and parallel to the north line of East 7th Street.

- (15) A gas main in ALAMO STREET from a point 5 feet north of Rosewood Avenue northerly 104 feet, the centerline of which gas main shall be 6.5 feet west of and parallel to the east property line of said Alamo Street.

Said gas main described above shall have a cover of not less than $2\frac{1}{2}$ feet.

- (16) A gas main in PENNSYLVANIA AVENUE from a point 75 feet west of Coleto Street easterly 340 feet, the centerline of which gas main shall be $13\frac{1}{2}$ feet south of and parallel to the north property line of said Pennsylvania Avenue

Said gas main described above shall have a cover of not less than $2\frac{1}{2}$ feet.

- (17) A gas main in MIRIAM AVENUE from East 17th Street northerly 352 feet, the centerline of which gas main shall be $6\frac{1}{2}$ feet west of and parallel to the east property line of said Miriam Avenue.

Said gas main described above shall have a cover of not less than $2\frac{1}{2}$ feet.

- (18) A gas main in SALINA STREET from Washington Avenue northerly 126 feet, the centerline of which gas main shall be $7\frac{1}{2}$ feet west of and parallel to the east property line of said Salina Street.

Said gas main described above shall have a cover of not less than $2\frac{1}{2}$ feet.

- (19) A gas main in EAST AVENUE from East 50th Street southerly 132 feet, the centerline of which gas main shall be $13\frac{1}{2}$ feet west of and parallel to the east property line of said East Avenue.

Said gas main described above shall have a cover of not less than $2\frac{1}{2}$ feet.

- (20) A gas main in PROSPECT AVENUE from a point 41 feet north of Tillotson Avenue northerly 72 feet, the centerline of which gas main shall be $6\frac{1}{2}$ feet east of and parallel to the west property line of said Prospect Avenue.

Said gas main described above shall have a cover of not less than $2\frac{1}{2}$ feet.

- (21) A gas main in CHESTNUT AVENUE from a point 170 feet south of East 34th Street southerly 150 feet, the centerline of which gas main shall be $7\frac{1}{2}$ feet west of and parallel to the east property line of said Chestnut Avenue.

Said gas main described above shall have a cover of not less than $2\frac{1}{2}$ feet.

- (22) A gas main in CONCORDIA AVENUE from a point 30 feet south of East 37th Street southerly 35 feet, the centerline of which gas main shall be $12\frac{1}{2}$ feet west of and parallel to the east property line of said Concordia Avenue.

Said gas main described above shall have a cover of not less than $2\frac{1}{2}$ feet.

- (23) A gas main in WOODMONT AVENUE from a point 257 feet east of Exposition Boulevard easterly 92 feet, the centerline of which gas main shall be $7\frac{1}{2}$ feet south of and parallel to the north property line of said Woodmont Avenue.

Said gas main described above shall have a cover of not less than $2\frac{1}{2}$ feet.

- (24) A gas main in TILLERY STREET from Gonzales Street southerly 401 feet, the centerline of which gas main shall be $7\frac{1}{2}$ feet west of and parallel to the east property line of said Tillery Street.

Said gas main described above shall have a cover of not less than $2\frac{1}{2}$ feet.

- (25) A gas main in PRUETT STREET from Wayside Drive easterly 287 feet, the centerline of which gas main shall be $7\frac{1}{2}$ feet south of and parallel to the north property line of said Pruett Street.

Said gas main described above shall have a cover of not less than $2\frac{1}{2}$ feet.

- (26) A gas main in ALLEN STREET across East 7th Street extension, the centerline of which gas main shall be $7\frac{1}{2}$ feet west of and parallel to the east property line of said Allen Street.

Said gas main described above shall have a cover of not less than $2\frac{1}{2}$ feet.

- (27) A gas main in EAST 2ND STREET from a point 271 feet west of Pedernales Street westerly 394 feet, the centerline of which gas main shall be 1 foot north of and parallel to the south property line of said East 2nd Street.

Said gas main described above shall have a cover of not less than $2\frac{1}{2}$ feet.

The Texas Public Service Company is hereby put upon notice that the City of Austin does not guarantee that the space assigned above is clear from other underground utilities, but is based upon the best records we have at hand, and that the minimum depth stated does not have any reference to the fact that greater depths may not be required at special points. When the Texas Public Service Company requires definite information upon the ground as to elevations or working points from which to base the location of their assignments, they shall apply to the Department of Public Works not less than three (3) days before such information is required. The Texas Public Service Company is further put upon notice that they will be required to bear the expense of repairs or replacement of any underground utility damaged during the construction of lines named in this resolution.

And that whenever pavement is cut in the vicinity of a fire plug, water must be used at intervals during the course of backfilling of the ditches.

That the work and laying of said gas mains, including the excavation in the streets and the restoration and maintenance of said streets after said mains have been laid, shall be under the supervision and direction of the City Manager, and under all the pertinent terms and conditions of the certain franchise granted to said Company by the City of Austin.

- (2) An underground telephone conduit across COLORADO STREET ALLEY, at a location 107 feet north of and parallel to West 6th Street.
