

WORKSESSION WEDNESDAY, NOVEMBER 20, 2002

The following represents the actions taken by the Austin City Council in the order they occurred during the meeting.

The City Council of Austin, Texas convened in a Work Session on Wednesday, November 20, 2002 at One Texas Center, 505 Barton Springs Road, 3RD Floor Training Room, Austin, Texas.

Mayor Garcia called the meeting to order at 10:00 a.m.

Briefings

- Report by the Austin Child Care Council on its goals, work and accomplishments regarding childcare, early education, and family support services.
