The regular order of business was suspended.

T. H. Seekats presented a petition signed by a number of residents on West 35th Street, asking for the opening of said street between King Street and West Avenue. The matter was referred to the City Manager and City Engineer for investigation and report to the Council at its next regular meeting.

A. M. Scott appeared before the Council to protest the excessive valuation placed on a lot owned by him in Edgeoliff Terrace, Travis Heights. The matter was taken under advisement with the Board of Equalization.

Councilman Wolf offered the following resolution:

WHEREAS, Thereupon it was also found that John L. Martin, of Austin, Texas, was the lowest and best bidder for that part of the work specified under bid No. 3, towit, for the construction of the electric work on and in said works, and that said bid was regular and proper in all particulars; therefore,

EE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that said bid of John L. Martin, under said bid No. 3, for the construction of the electric work on and in said works, for the aggregate sum of \$1017.00, be and the same is hereby accepted, subject to the approval of the Federal Emergency Administration of Public Works; and the City Manager, in behalf of the City of Austin, is authorized and instructed to enter into contract with John L. Martin for such purposes, subject to the approval of the Federal Emergency Administration of Public Works.

- (2) A telephone pole line in OWEN AVENUE from West 34th Street north one block, the centerline of which pole line shall be 8 feet east of and parallel to the west line of said Owen Avenue.
- (3) One telephone pole in SAN GABRIEL STREET ALLEY south of 34th Street, which pole shall be 1 foot west of the east line of said San Gabriel Street Alley.
- (4) A telephone pole line in PRATT AVENUE north 3 blocks from West 34th Street, the centerline of which pole line shall be 9 feet west of and parallel to the east line of said Pratt Avenue.
- (5) One telephone pole in KING STREET between West 36th Street and West 37th Street, which pole shall be 1 foot east of the west line of said King Street.

- (9) One telephone pole in WEST FORTY-SECOND STREET west of Rosedale Avenue, which pole shall be 8 feet north of the south line of said West 42nd Street.
- (10) A telephone pole line in BELLVUE AVENUE ALLEY from West 43rd Street to West 45th Street, the centerline of which pole line shall be 1 foot west of and parallel to the east line of said Bellvue Avenue Alley.
- (11) A telephone pole line in ALICE AVENUE ALLEY from West 42nd Street to West 43rd Street, the centerline of which pole line shall be 1 foot west of and parallel to the east line of said Alice Avenue Alley.

WHEREAS, Texas Public Service Company has presented to the City Council tentative maps or plans showing the proposed construction of its gas mains in the streets in the City of Austin hereafter named, and said maps or plans have been considered by the City Council; therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF AUSTIN:

THAT Texas Public Service Company be and the same is hereby permitted to lay and construct its gas mains in and upon the following streets:

(1) A gas main in EAST THIRTY-SECOND STREET beginning at a point 8 feet north of and 1 30 feet east of the intersection of the south line of East 32nd Street and the west line of Robinson Street;

Thence in a westerly direction with the centerline of a gas main, which centerline shall be 8 feet north of and parallel to the south line of East 32nd Street, for a distance of 170 feet.

Said gas main described above shall have a cover of not less than 21 feet.

(2) A gas main in DEPEW AVENUE beginning at a point 52 feet west of and 210 feet north of the intersection of the east line of Depew Avenue and the north line of East 46th Street,

Thence in a southerly direction with a gas main, the centerline of which shall be so feet west of and parallel to the east line of said Depew Avenue, for a distance of 556 feet.

Said gas main described above shall have a cover of not less than  $2\frac{1}{2}$  feet.

(3) A gas main in EAST FORTY-SIXTH STREET beginning at a point 15 feet north of and Si feet west of the intersection of the east line of Depew Avenue and the south line of East 45th Street;

Thence in an easterly direction with a gas main, the centerline of which shall be 15 feet north of and parallel to the south line of said East 46th Street, for a distance of approximately 150 feet to the City limit line.

Said gas main described above shall have a cover of not less than 22 feet.

The Texas Public Service Company is hereby put upon notice that the City of Austin does not guarantee that the space assigned above is clear from other underground utilities, but is based upon the best records we have at hand, and that the minimum depth stated does not have any reference to the fact that greater depths may be required at special points. When the Texas Public Service Company requires definite information upon the ground as to elevations or working points from which to base the location of their assignments, they shall apply to the City Engineering Department not less than three (3) days before such information is required. The Texas Public Service Company is further put upon notice that they will be required to bear the expense of repairs or replacement of any underground utility damaged during the construction of lines named in this resolution.

AND THAT whenever pavement is cut in the vicinity of a fire plug, water must be used at intervals during the course of backfilling of the ditches.

THAT the sum of \$2.50 be and the same is hereby appropriated out of the General Fund, not otherwise appropriated, for the purpose of refunding to Lou Sweet the amount of cigarette dealer's license paid by him for the year 1934, under License No. 6272.

WHEREAS, Texas Public Service Company has presented to the City Council tentative maps or plans showing the proposed construction of its gas mains in the streets in the City of Austin hereafter named, and said maps or plans have been considered by the City Council; therefore.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF AUSTIN:

THAT Texas Public Service Company be and the same is hereby permitted to lay and construct its gas mains in and upon the following streets:

(1) A 4" cast iron gas main in SAN JACINTO STREET, beginning at a point 24 feet south of and 29 feet east of the intersection of the north line of East Sth Street and the west line of San Jacinto Street;

Thence in a northerly direction with said gas main, the centerline of which shall be 29 feet east of and parallel to the west line of said San Jacinto Street, to the north line of East 10th Street.

Said gas main described above shall have a cover of not less than 2 feet.

(2) A 4" cast iron gas main crossing SAN JACINTO STREET, beginning at a point on the west line produced of San Jacinto Street, at a point 24 feet south of the north line of East Sth Street;

Thence crossing said San Jacinto Street to a point on the east line produced of San Jacinto Street, which point shall be 24 feet south of the north line of East Sth Street.

Said gas main described above shall have a cover of not less than 2 feet.

(3) A 3" cast iron gas main at the intersection of EAST NINTH STREET and SAN JACIN-TO STREET as follows:

Beginning at a point 29 feet east of and 19 feet north of the intersection of the west line of San Jacinto Street and the south line of East 9th Street;

Thence in a westerly direction to a point on the west line produced of San Jacinto Street, which point shall be 19 feet north of the south line of East 9th Street.

Said gas main described above shall have a cover of not less than 2 feet.

(4) A 2" gas main in the intersection of EAST NINTH STREET and SAN JACINTO STREET, as follows:

Beginning at a point 29 feet east of and 19 feet north of the intersection of the west line of San Jacinto Street and the south line of East 9th Street;

Thence in an easterly direction to a point on the east line produced of San Jacinto Street, which point shall be 19 feet north of the south line of East 9th Street.

Said gas main described above shall have a cover of not less than 2 feet.

(5) A  $^{44}$  cast iron gas main in the intersection of EAST TENTH STREET and SAN JACIN- TO STREET, as follows:

Beginning at a point 29 feet east of and 25 feet north of the intersection of the west line of San Jacinto Street and the south line of East 10th Street:

Thence in a westerly direction to a point on the west line produced of San Jacinto Street, which point shall be 25 feet north of the south line of East 10th Street.

Said gas main described above shall have a cover of not less than 2 feet.

(6) A 2" gas main within the intersection of EAST TENTH STREET and SAN JACINTO STREET, as follows:

Beginning at a point 29 feet east of and 19 feet north of the intersection of the west line of San Jacinto Street and the south line of East 10th Street;

Thence in an easterly direction to a point on the east line produced of San Jacinto Street, which point shall be 19 feet north of the south line of East 10th Street.

Said gas main described above shall have a cover of not less than 2 feet.

The Texas Public Service Company is hereby put upon notice that the City of Austin does not guarantee that the space assigned above is clear from other underground utilities, but is based upon the best records we have at hand, and that the minimum depth

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stated does not have any reference to the fact that greater depths may be required at special points. When the Texas Public Service Company requires definite information upon the ground as to elevations or working points from which to base the location of their assignments, they shall apply to the City Engineering Department not less than three (3) days before such information is required. The Texas Public Service Company is further put upon notice that they will be required to bear the expense of repairs or replacement of any underground utility damaged during the construction of lines named in this resolution.

AND THAT the Texas Public Service Company is hereby put upon notice that all paving repairs incidental to the construction of the gas mains described above shall be made at the expense of the said Texas Public Service Company.

AND THAT the replacement of the concrete base for the asphalt topping shall be one monolithic job and the work shall be carried on without interruption, thereby preventing construction joints in the base.

AND THAT whenever pavement is out in the vicinity of a fire plug, water must be used at intervals during the course of backfilling of the ditches.

THAT the work and laying of said gas mains, including the excavation in the streets and the restoration and maintenance of said streets after said mains have been laid, shall be under the supervision and direction of the City Manager, and under all the pertinent terms and conditions of the certain franchise granted to said company by the City of Austin.

Upon motion of Councilman Alford, the resolution was adopted by the following vote: Ayes, Councilman Alford, Bartholomew, Gillis, Mayor Miller, and Councilman Wolf, 5; nays, none.

Councilman Gillis moved that the Red Cross Society be granted a temporary permit to hang triangular signs, measuring five feet, to the electric light poles on Congress Avenue as a means of advertising their drive for the week of November 12th to 17th. The motion carried by the following vote: Ayes, Councilmen Alford, Bartholomew, Gillis, Mayor Miller, and Councilman Wolf, 5; nays, none.

The matter of water line extension to the residence of W. C. Treadwell on Woodmont Avenue, situated outside of the corporate limits, as submitted by Councilman Bartholomew, was referred to the City Manager, City Attorney, and Superintendent of Water Lines for adjustment.

The matter of widening the underpass of the International & Great Northern Railroad on Enfield Road was referred to the City Manager for attention.

There being no further business, Councilman Gillis moved to recess subject to call of the Mayor. The motion carried by the following vote: Ayes, Councilmen Alford, Bartholomew, Gillis, Mayor Miller, and Councilman Wolf, 5; nays, none.

The Council then recessed.

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
